## A TRIBUTE TO DAN ROONEY

The Steelers have won each of their first three primetime games of 2017 - defeating the Detroit Lions 20-15 on Sunday Night Football in Week 8, the Tennessee Titans at Heinz Field 40-17 on Thursday Night Football in Week 11 and the Green Bay Packers at Heinz Field on Sunday Night Football 31-28 in Week 12.

Pittsburgh is slated to remain on national television in primetime each of the next two weeks. The Steelers will travel to face the Cincinnati Bengals on Dec. 4 for a Monday Night Football tilt and welcome the Baltimore Ravens to Pittsburgh for a Sunday Night Football game on Dec. 10.

For the second consecutive year, and for the second time in franchise history, the Steelers will play on Christmas Day. Pittsburgh will travel to Houston for a Monday, Dec. 25 matchup at the Texans (NBC, 4:30 p.m.).

The Steelers' bye week took place on Nov. 5 (Week 9).



Throughout the 2017 season, Steelers players will sport a patch on the right side of their jerseys in memory of the late Chairman Ambassador Dan Rooney. The patch - with Rooney's initials - DMR - which stands for Daniel Milton Rooney - is lovingly enveloped in black and gold shamrock to honor, remember and show love and respect for the man who was more than an owner, but family to the players.

## STEELERS HALL OF HONOR

The Steelers announced their inaugural Hall of Honor class on Aug. 29 at an event in the PNC Champions Club at Heinz Field. Each inductee received a replica of a solid steel football, which will replicate the original that was given to Steelers' founder Art Rooney Sr. by the United States Steel Corporation and United Steel Workers in 1982 on the occasion of the team's 50th Season.

They are part of a display to be located inside the FedEx Great Hall at Heinz Field.

The Steelers announced plans for a Hall of Honor on Aug. 1. The Hall of Honor will induct former players, coaches, and front office personnel who were integral in creating and sustaining the franchise's success dating back to when the team was founded in 1933.

# THE STEELERS IN 2017

**LB T.J. Watt (1st round, 30th overall):** Played collegiately at the University of Wisconsin...appeared in 27 games, making 14 starts, over a two-year span...recorded 70 tackles, including 17 stops for losses and 11.5 sacks in his career.

**WR JuJu Smith-Schuster (2nd round, 62nd overall):** Played collegiately at the University of Southern California...totaled 213 catches for 3,092 yards with 25 touchdown catches in 40 games played (39 starts).

**CB Cameron Sutton (3rd round, 94th overall):** Started all 45 games in his Tennessee career, notching 127 tackles, 13.0 tackles for losses, seven interceptions, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries...his 30 career pass breakups are a school record...also returned 45 punts for 657 yards with three touchdowns.

**RB James Conner (3rd round, 105th overall):** Finished his University of Pittsburgh career second on the school's all-time charts for rushing yards (3,733), total touchdowns (56) and rushing touchdowns (52) charts, while setting Atlantic Coast Conference records in total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns.

**QB Joshua Dobbs (4th round, 135th overall):** Compiled a 23-12 record as a starting quarterback at the University of Tennessee, including 3-0 in Bowl games...his collegiate numbers include 9,360 yards of total offense (7,138 passing, 2,160 rushing and 62 receiving), while setting school records for career rushing yards by a quarterback, career rushing touchdowns by a quarterback (32) and single-season rushing scores by a quarterback (12 in 2016).

**DB Brian Allen (5th round, 173rd overall):** Appeared in 42 games at the University of Utah, making 12 starts, and tallied 62 tackles (44 solo), 14 passes defensed and five interceptions.

## FROM LAST GAME VS. GREEN BAY



### THE STEELERS

- Pittsburgh is 9-2 (4-1 at home), 3-0 in primetime games and finished 3-1 against NFC North teams in 2017.
- Pittsburgh has won at least four regular-season home games in a season for the 18th straight year, dating back to 2000, extending its longest active streak in the NFL.
- The Steelers have won at least nine of their first 11 games of a season for the seventh time in team history, and the first since 2004 (10-1).
- The Steelers have won each of their previous six games, dating back to Oct. 15, 2017, at Kansas City.
- Pittsburgh is 3-0 in its last three games at Heinz Field, dating back to Oct. 22, 2017, vs. Cincinnati.
- The Steelers are now 16-18 in regular-season history against the Packers (8-7 at home) and 2-0 at Heinz Field.
- Pittsburgh is now 2-0 in primetime games against Green Bay during the regular season in the modern era of the NFL (Monday Night Football: Nov. 9, 1998, W, 27-20 at Three Rivers Stadium).
- The Steelers have won five consecutive regular-season games against the Packers, and each of the previous five in Pittsburgh.
- Pittsburgh improved to 9-5 in regular-season games against Green Bay in the month of November (6-4 at home in the month).
- Pittsburgh is now 26-20 on Sunday Night Football (12-7 at home).
- The Steelers have won eight consecutive Sunday Night Football games, dating back to Dec. 15, 2013.
- Pittsburgh is now 24-7 at Heinz Field in primetime games since the stadium opened in 2001, and 9-6 on Sunday Night Football at Heinz Field.
- The Steelers have won five consecutive games in the month of November, dating back to Nov. 20, 2016.
- The Steelers are 453-284-2 during the regular season since 1970.
- Pittsburgh earned its 250th regular-season win in the free agency era of the NFL (since 1993), joining New England (269) and Green Bay (250) as the only teams with at least 250 wins since 1993.
- The Steelers' 38 sacks in 2017 tie as the team's fourth-most in the first 11 games of a season since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 (2001: 41, 1983: 41, 1994: 40, 1996: 38, 2008: 37).
- Pittsburgh has scored at least 30 points in back-to-back games for the first time since 2016 (Oct. 2-Oct. 9).
- The Steelers have scored a touchdown on their first offensive possession in each of the last two games.
- The Steelers' streak of consecutive games without allowing a touchdown on an opponent's first offensive possession was snapped, ending at 27 games.

### HEAD COACH MIKE TOMLIN

- Led the Steelers to nine wins in the first 11 games of a season for the first time in his head coaching tenure since (2007).
- Improved his regular-season record to 112-59 since becoming the Steelers' head coach in 2007 (63-22 at home).
- Improved to 3-0 as Pittsburgh's head coach in regular-season games vs. Green Bay (2-0 at home).
- Upped his record to 29-15 in regular-season games vs. NFC opponents (17-5 at home).
- Is now 33-16 in regular-season primetime games (16-8 on Sunday Night Football) and 18-5 at Heinz Field under the lights (8-4 on Sunday Night Football).
- Improved to 27-17 in regular-season games during the month of November (14-8 at home).
- Improved to 9-1 in regular-season home games at Heinz Field since the stadium opened in 2001 when entering halftime tied.

## FROM LAST GAME VS. GREEN BAY

### QB BEN ROETHLISBERGER

- Completed 33-of-45 passes for 351 yards with four touchdowns and two interceptions for a passer rating of 106.8.
- Led the Steelers to a game-winning drive for the 41st time in his NFL career (regular season: 37 / postseason: 4).
- Added 25 rushing yards on three carries – the 11th regular-season game of his NFL career with at least 25 yards on the ground.
- Improved to 132-62 as a starter during the regular season (73-23 at home).
- Increased his Steelers franchise record for the most wins as a starting quarterback to 132 (Terry Bradshaw, 107).
- His 132 wins as a starting quarterback in regular-season games are the seventh-most in NFL history.
- Is now 20-3 in regular-season primetime games at Heinz Field, including 8-3 on Sunday night at home.

**PITTSBURGH** – The Steelers defense allowed less than 200 yards of total offense in Pittsburgh's 29-14 victory over the Cincinnati Bengals at Heinz Field.

**RB Le'Veon Bell** amassed 55 scrimmage yards (32 rushing / 23 receiving) in the first quarter, but it was **WR Antonio Brown** who got the Steelers on the board with a 7-yard touchdown reception from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** on Pittsburgh's opening drive.

In the second quarter, Roethlisberger found **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster** in the end zone for a 31-yard touchdown.

With the score tied at 14-14, a pair of field goals from **K Chris Boswell** on back-to-back possessions gave Pittsburgh a 20-14 edge going into halftime.

When play resumed, Pittsburgh's defense continued to stifle the Bengal's attack. **CB Joe Haden** and **CB William Gay** picked off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton on back-to-back Bengals drives, while Boswell knocked down two more field goals from 41- and 49-yards out.

Four sacks from Pittsburgh's defense in the fourth quarter sealed the Steelers victory, improving their record to 5-2. Bell finished with 192 scrimmage yards (134 rushing / 58 receiving), eclipsing 150 yards for the second-straight week. Boswell went 5-for-5 on field goals and added two extra points.

**Mike Tomlin** has guided the Steelers to a 63-22 career regular-season record at Heinz Field.

Tomlin earned his 50th regular season home win in Week Nine in 2015 vs. Oakland and joined Chuck Noll (119) and Bill Cowher (85) as the third head coach in Steelers history with 50 regular season home victories.

Tomlin has led Pittsburgh to at least five home wins in each of his first 10 seasons - through 2016 - as the team's head coach and six home wins in seven of his 10 at the helm through 2016.

Since the 2011 season, the Steelers have played in 31 primetime games, including a Week Eight on Sunday Night Football at Detroit (W, 20-15), a Thursday Night Football tilt at Heinz Field in Week 11 vs. Tennessee (W, 40-17) and a Sunday Night Football game vs. Green Bay at Heinz Field in Week 12 (W, 31-28) in 2017.

Mike Tomlin, the 11th-year head coach, has guided Pittsburgh to a 33-16 overall record in regular-season primetime games.

He is 10-2 on Monday Night Football, 16-8 on Sunday Night Football and 7-6 on Thursday Night Football.

## TOMLIN IN 10



In his first 10 seasons as the head coach of the Steelers, **Mike Tomlin** has an extensive list of accomplishments.

Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in Week 14 of 2016 at Buffalo in his 157th career regular-season games to mark the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark in the win column (Chuck Noll: 158 and Bill Cowher: 163).

His 103 wins in his first 10 seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach in his first 10 campaigns and his two Super Bowl appearances are second-most for the franchise for a coach in his first 10 seasons.

Tomlin's seven postseason berths are tied as the most in a coach's first 10 seasons with the Steelers and his five division titles are third-most.

## TOMLIN'S 100TH IN 10

**Mike Tomlin** became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 100-win club to make the Steelers the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.

Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2001: 99 and Chuck Noll: 1976-78: 88).

Tomlin also joined an elite head coach fraternity in NFL history by reaching 100 wins in his 10th season:

- He is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons with one franchise, joining Bill Belichick (New England), Mike Ditka (Chicago), Joe Gibbs (Washington), John Madden (Oakland), Mike McCarthy (Green Bay), Marty Schottenheimer (Kansas City), Mike Shanahan (Denver) and Don Shula (Miami).

## TOMLIN GOING FOR TWO

**QB Ben Roethlisberger** connected with **WR Antonio Brown** on a two-point attempt in Week 12 vs. Green Bay in 2017, the team's second successful two-point attempt of the season.

Pittsburgh converted three of its nine two-point attempts in 2016, their first two conversions both coming in the first quarter of games (Oct. 2 vs. Kansas City and Oct. 16 at Miami).

The Steelers converted 8-of-11 two-point attempts in 2015. Their eight successful two-point conversions set a new NFL record in a single-season.

## CONTROLLING THE NORTH

**QB Ben Roethlisberger** has quarterbacked the Steelers to a 9-2 start, including a 3-0 mark vs. AFC North foes, in 2017.

In Week One, Roethlisberger completed 24-of-36 passes for 263 yards with two touchdowns and an interception. The win marked his 50th as a starter in his regular-season career against AFC North Opponents.

Roethlisberger earned his 125th regular-season victory as a starter in the 26-9 win against Minnesota in Week Two. He completed 23-of-35 passing for 243 yards with two touchdowns for a passer rating of 104.8 in the win.

In Week Five, Roethlisberger's 312 passing yards marked the 50th 300-yard game of his regular-season career to become the 11th quarterback in NFL history to throw for at least 300 yards in 50 regular-season games and the ninth to do so with one team.

Roethlisberger threw four touchdowns - three to WR Antonio Brown - completing 30 passes with zero interceptions in Week 11 on Thursday Night Football vs. Tennessee.

Roethlisberger made his 150th career regular season start in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis in 2014 to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to record 100 wins in their first 150 regular season starts (Tom Brady: 116, Joe Montana: 108, Terry and Bradshaw: 102).

Roethlisberger registered his 90<sup>th</sup> career win in his 135<sup>th</sup> career start, becoming the fifth fastest quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 90 wins.

He earned his 130th win as a starting quarterback in his 192nd start in Week 10 of 2017 at Indianapolis to mark the third-fewest starts in NFL history to win 130 games (Tom Brady: 168 and Peyton Manning: 189).

**QB Ben Roethlisberger** is 52-17 (.754) as a starter against AFC North opponents during his career and led the Steelers to the best divisional record during the 2013 and 2014 regular seasons (4-2) and in 2016 (4-1).

Since 2010, Roethlisberger is 28-10 against divisional foes during the regular season.

## FACING THE NFC

In 51 career regular-season games against NFC opponents, **QB Ben Roethlisberger** has posted a 35-16 record, including winning each of his first seven starts against conference members.

Roethlisberger completed 23-of-35 passing for 243 yards with two touchdowns for a passer rating of 104.8 in Week Two's 26-9 win at Heinz Field against the Minnesota Vikings, and tallied his first 300-yard game of 2017, leading the Steelers to a 20-15 win at Detroit in Week Eight, finishing with 317 yards, including a 97-yard touchdown connection with WR JuJu Smith-Schuster. He completed 33-of-45 passes for 351 yards with four touchdowns and two interceptions for a passer rating of 106.8, leading the Steelers to a game-winning drive for the 41st time in his NFL career (regular season: 37 / postseason: 4) in a 31-28 win vs. Green Bay on Sunday Night Football in Week 12.

**WR Antonio Brown** leads all NFL players with 80 receptions and 1,195 receiving yards in 2017.

Brown has eclipsed 100 receiving yards in six of the Steelers' 11 games of 2017, and added 10 or more catches in five.

Brown opened the 2017 season setting a new team Kickoff Weekend record for receptions with 11 for 182 receiving yards - the second-most by a Steeler in a Week One matchup. His 182 receiving yards marked the 30th 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career, breaking a tie for the most such games in team history.

In Week 11 vs. Tennessee, Brown caught three touchdowns for the second time in his NFL career in a game, finishing with 10 catches for 144 receiving yards.

**WR Antonio Brown** reached the 7,500 scrimmage yard milestone in Week Three's game at Philadelphia in 2016. He accomplished the feat in his 89th career regular-season game to tie Calvin Johnson for the fourth-fewest games to 7,500 scrimmage yards by a wide receiver in NFL history.

Brown reached the 8,000 scrimmage yard mark in Week 10's game vs. Dallas in 2016, in his 95th career regular-season game to mark the sixth-fewest games to 8,000 scrimmage yards by a wide receiver in NFL history.

In Week Five vs. Jacksonville, Brown totaled 10 catches for 157 receiving yards to eclipse the 9,000 scrimmage yard barrier. He reached 9,000 career scrimmage yards in 106 regular-season games - marking the third-fewest games to the milestone in Steelers history (Jerome Bettis: 101 and Franco Harris: 104) and tied Randy Moss for the fifth-fewest games to the milestone by a wide receiver in NFL history.

Smith-Schuster totaled single-game career highs in receptions (7) and receiving yards (193), including a 97-yard touchdown catch-and-run from QB Ben Roethlisberger in the team's Week Eight 20-15 win at Detroit. The 97-yard connection is the longest pass play in team history and ties as the longest offensive play in franchise annals. His 193 receiving yards marked the second-most by a Steelers rookie in a single-game, behind Jimmy Orr's 205 on Dec. 13, 1958.

He led the Steelers in receptions (five) and receiving yards (97) to go along with a touchdown catch in Week 10's 20-17 win at Indianapolis. Smith-Schuster caught a seven-yard touchdown pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the third quarter - the fifth touchdown reception of his 2017 rookie season - extending his streak of consecutive games with a touchdown catch to three. In the game, he hauled in a 44-yard reception in the third quarter. He has at least one catch of 40+ yards in each of his last two games (Oct. 29 at Detroit: 97Y and 41).

His five touchdown catches are the most in NFL history by a player before his 21st birthday (turned 21 on Nov. 22).

## RINGING THE BELL



**RB Le'Veon Bell** leads the NFL with 981 rushing yards and 1,377 yards from scrimmage in 2017. He has rushed for at least 100 yards in three games, while adding at least 100 scrimmage yards in six.

Bell led all players with a game high 186 yards from scrimmage (144 rushing yards on 35 carries / 42 receiving yards on four catches) and scored two rushing touchdowns in the team's 26-9 Week Four win at Baltimore.

The Michigan State product tallied 179 rushing yards - tying as the tenth-most in a regular-season game in Steelers history - and the fourth-most in his NFL career in the team's Week Six win at Kansas City.

Bell led all players in rushing yards (134 on 35 carries) and yards from scrimmage (192: 134 rushing / 58 receiving) in Week Seven's 29-14 win vs. Cincinnati at Heinz Field.

On Sunday Night Football in Week 12 vs. Green Bay, Bell led all players with game highs in rushing yards (95 on 20 carries), yards from scrimmage 183 (95 rushing / 88 receiving) and receptions (12). His 12 receptions establish personal single-game high (previous: 10, twice) and are the most by a Steelers running back in a single-game.

RB Le'Veon Bell became the third player in Steelers history with at least 3,000 rushing and 1,500 receiving yards in Week Six at Miami in 2016, joining Franco Harris and Merrill Hoge.

Bell reached the 3,000 rushing and 1,500 receiving yard mark in his 38th career regular-season game, surpassing Edgerrin James (42 games) for the fewest games in NFL history to reach the milestone.

## OVER 200 TIMES TWO AND FOUR

RB Le'Veon Bell eclipsed 200 rushing yards for the second time in his NFL regular-season career in Week 14 at Buffalo in 2016, racking up a franchise record 236 yards. ## THE OUTLAW JESSE JAMES

**TE Jesse James** caught six passes for 41 yards with two touchdown catches in the Steelers Week One 21-18 win at Cleveland. It was the first career multi-touchdown game of his NFL career - and marked the 10th such game by a Steelers tight end since 1960 and the first since 2012 (Heath Miller, Sept. 23, 2012 at Oakland).

James hauled in two passes for 42 yards, including a career-long reception of 32 yards from QB Ben Roethlisberger in the second quarter of the team's Week Eight 20-15 win at Detroit.

In Week 11 vs. Tennessee, James caught five passes for 21 yards, including a one-yard touchdown pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the fourth quarter, matching a single-season career high of three touchdown receptions (2016).

His 2017 totals include 28 receptions for 246 yards with three touchdown catches.

## STEELERS ADD MCDONALD

The Steelers acquired veteran **TE Vance McDonald** via trade with the San Francisco 49ers on Aug. 29.

McDonald entered the NFL as a second-round (55th overall) draft selection of San Francisco in 2013. He has started 35-of-55 games played and his career numbers include 69 receptions for 945 yards and eight touchdowns.

McDonald scored his first touchdown as a Steeler, on a seven-yard pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the fourth quarter of Week 10's 20-17 win at Indianapolis, increasing his career total to eight touchdown receptions.

## HARRISON SETS TEAM SACK MARK



LB James Harrison brought down Cleveland QB Cody Kessler in Week 11's game of 2016 to increase his Steelers sack total to 77.5 to set the Steelers mark for the most sacks since the statistic became official in 1982. Harrison posted his first sack of 2017 in Week Six at Kansas City, becoming the first Steeler with at least 80.0 sacks since the stat became official in 1982:

## BIG PLAY GAY

CB William Gay notched 5 tackles in Pittsburgh's Week One 21-18 win at Cleveland. In Week Seven vs. Cincinnati, Gay hauled in an interception, marking the 13th of his NFL career and 11th as a Steeler, picking off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton.

Gay picked off Cincinnati QB AJ McCarron and returned the ball 23 yards for a touchdown in Week 14's game of 2015. It marked Gay's fifth consecutive interception return for a touchdown, setting a new NFL record, and his fifth pick six with the Steelers, tying Rod Woodson for the most in team history:

Along with 87 tackles, the fourth-year linebacker has totaled three interceptions, 11 passes defended, two quarterback hits, three tackles for losses, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.

The fourth-year linebacker registered a game high 11 tackles (11 solo), with a tackle for loss, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery at Chicago in Week Three.

Shazier totaled 5 tackles (5 solo) and an interception in Week 10 at Indianapolis, picking off Indianapolis QB Jacoby Brissett in the fourth quarter – his third interception of 2017 – matching his single-season career high set in 2016.

He led the Steelers defense with 10 tackles (5 solo) in Week 11 vs. Tennessee, marking his eighth career regular-season game with at least 10 tackles and his third such game of 2017.

In Week 12 vs. Green Bay, Shazier posted a team-best 8 tackles (7 solo), adding a pass defended.

## MITCHELL IN THE BACKFIELD

S Mike Mitchell led Pittsburgh's secondary with 11 tackles, all solo, in Week Three at Chicago, along with adding one pass defended.

He tallied 1 solo tackle in Week One's 21-18 win at Cleveland and tallied a pass defended with two tackles in Week Two vs. Minnesota.

**LB T.J. Watt** - the Steelers' first round selection the 2017 NFL Draft - has recorded 35 tackles (27 solo), 5.0 sacks, 7 tackles for losses, seven quarterback hits, six passes defended and an interception in 10 games played, all starts, in his rookie season.

In Week 11 vs. Tennessee, Watt was credited with a field goal block on a Tennessee K Ryan Succop 48-yard attempt in the second quarter.

Watt's 5.0 sacks rank him tied for second among the 2017 rookie class and are the second-most by a Steelers rookie:

Watt started his regular-season career in historical fashion. He became the first player to record at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut on Kickoff Weekend since sacks became an official statistic in 1982. He finished Week 1's 21-18 win at Cleveland with 6 tackles (5 solo), 2.0 sacks, two tackles for losses, one quarterback hit and one interception.

With his 2.0 sack and one interception performance, Watt became:

- Third player in NFL history to record 2.0 sacks and an interception in an NFL debut, joining Charles Glaze (Oct. 4, 1987) and Tommy Haynes (Oct. 4, 1987).
- First Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks in their NFL debut since sacks became an official statistic in 1982 (previous mark, 1.5, Kenny Davidson, Sept. 9, 1990 at Cleveland).
- First Steeler with at least 2.0 sacks and an interception in the same game since 2010 (LaMarr Woodley, Dec. 12 vs. Cincinnati).

## HILTON MAKING AN IMPACT

**CB Mike Hilton** tallied the first sack and interception of his NFL career in the Steelers' 26-9 win at Baltimore in Week Four. His sack, a six-yard takedown of Baltimore QB Joe Flacco came in the third quarter, and his interception off of Flacco in the fourth quarter.

In Week 11 vs. Tennessee, Hilton picked off QB Marcus Mariota on the Titans' first offensive possession of the game - marking the Steelers' first of four interceptions in the team's 40-17 win.

The Mississippi product joined the Steelers' practice squad in December of 2016, and he has started three-of-11 games played with Pittsburgh in 2017, recording 38 tackles (27 solo), 1.0 sack, two interceptions, five quarterback hits and six tackles for losses and two passes defended.

The Steelers signed **CB Joe Haden** to a three-year contract on Aug. 30.

Haden, a two-time Pro Bowl selection, made his Steelers debut, appearing in the 91st game of his NFL regular-season career and posted six tackles and 1.0 sack, on Kickoff Weekend at the Cleveland Browns. He brought down Cleveland QB DeShone Kizer for a sack of three yards to end the first half - his first sack with the Steelers - third of his NFL career - and first since Sept. 11, 2011 (with Cleveland). In Week Seven vs. Cincinnati, Haden hauled in the 20th interception of his NFL career and his first as a Steeler, picking off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton in the third quarter.

His 106 passes defended since entering the NFL in 2010 are the second-most among all NFL defenders:

The University of Florida product was a first-round (seventh overall) draft selection of the Browns in 2010. He has started 90-of-99 games played in the NFL and his career numbers include 385 tackles (312 solo), 20 interceptions, 106 passes defended, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 3.0 sacks.

## 100 AND 20

**CB Joe Haden** became the ninth active player in the NFL to record at least 100 passes defended and 20 interceptions. Haden tallied his first interception as a Steeler and the 20th of his NFL career in the team's 29-14 win vs. Cincinnati in Week Seven.

## WILLIAMS ON THE 'D'

**LB Vince Williams** has set a single-season career high and ranks second on the team with 6.0 sacks in 2017, surpassing his previous mark of 2.0 in 2016.

He posted his first career multi-sack game, finishing with 2.0 against the Chiefs in Week Six.

The Florida State sacked Indianapolis QB Jacoby Brissett in Week 10 for a loss of four yards in the fourth quarter.

Williams brought down Tennessee QB Marcus Mariota for a nine-yard loss in Week 11, increasing his 2017 sack total to 6.0. He finished the game with 7 tackles (6 solo), three quarterback hits, two tackles for losses and one sack.

Williams has started each of the team's 11 games in 2017, and established a single-season career high 57 tackles (45 solo), along with a career-best nine quarterback hits and adding nine tackles for losses.

## BOS-DOES-WELL



**K Chris Boswell** has converted 25-of-28 field goal attempts in 2017.

- He was successful on each of his three extra point attempts in the team's 21-18 win at Cleveland in Week One, and converted each of his four field goal attempts in the team's 26-9 win in Week Two against Minnesota at Heinz Field.
- Against Jacksonville in Week Five, Boswell made each of his three field goal tries, and converted a 24-yard attempt in Week Six at Kansas City.
- Boswell converted five field goal attempts, (22-, 24- and 41-, 49-, 25-yards), tying as the fourth-most in a single game in franchise history and the second-most in his NFL career (six, Dec. 18, 2016 at Cincinnati) in Week Seven's 29-14 win vs. Cincinnati.
- In Week 10, Boswell converted a 33-yard field goal as time expired to lift the Steelers to a 20-17 win at Indianapolis - the second game-winning kick of his regular-season career.
- Boswell made each of his four field goal attempts – 41-, 28-, 50- and 26-yards – against Tennessee in Week 11. His 50-yard field goal marked the third field goal of at least 50 yards in his NFL career, all occurring at Heinz Field (51 yards twice).
- Boswell converted his sole field goal attempt in Week 12 as time expired on a game-winning and career-long 53 yard try - marking the longest field goal by a Steeler in Heinz Field history, tying as the longest kick by an NFL player at the venue and tying as the fourth-longest field goal in franchise record books.

Since joining the Steelers in 2015, Boswell is 75-of-85 overall on field goal attempts (88.2%), including 27-of-32 (84.4%) between 40-49 yards.

His 88.2 field goal percent ranks first in Steelers history among kickers with at least 30 field goal attempts:

## A LAND DOWN IN THE 20

**P Jordan Berry** boomed six punts covering 275 yards (45.8 average) in the team's 21-18 win at Cleveland on Kickoff Weekend, and landed two inside Chicago's 20-yard line in Week Three.

Through Week 12, Berry has punted 46 times (1,986 yards) for a 43.2 average, in 2017, with 19 landing inside the opponent 20.

Berry, in his third season in the NFL and with the Steelers, has pinned opponents inside their 20-yard line 72 times in his career to become the seventh player in Steelers history with at least 50.
