NOTABLE STORYLINES

♣ The Browns return to FirstEnergy Stadium for the first of consecutive home games when they host the Green Bay Packers at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Dec. 10. The Packers hold a 12-7 advantage in the all-time regular season series, including a 6-4 mark in Cleveland.

€ Last season, the Browns finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense. Through 13 weeks this year, the Browns rank 10th in total defense and sixth in rushing defense. The highest the Browns have finished in run defense since 1999 was in 2013 when the team finished 18th.

Since Week 8, the Browns are fourth in the league with \$4.95 rush average. Overall, the Browns are ninth in the NFL with a rushing average of 4.36 yards. In 2016, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average.

WR Josh Gordon, who was appearing in his first game ce Dec. 21, 2014, recorded four receptions for 85 yards at Los Angeles. Gordon has appeared in 36 games since joining the Browns as a second-round pick in the 2012 supplemental draft. He has 165 receptions for 2,839 yards and 14 touchdowns. In 2013, he led the NFL with 1,646 receiving yards.

LBs **Joe Schobert** and **Christian Kirksey** rank tied for cond and tied for fifth in the NFL in tackles this season, respectively. The pair has played every defensive snap for the Browns this season and join N.Y. Jets LB Demario Davis and K.C. DB Ron Parker as the only players in the NFL to have played every defensive snap for their team this season.

In seven games this season, rookie DL **Myles Garrett** recorded 21 tackles, five sacks and one fumble recovery. Despite playing just seven games, he is tied for second among all NFL rookies in sacks.

Rookie TE **David Njoku** is leading the Browns with four reiving touchdowns. His four receiving scores are the most ever by a Browns rookie tight end. The first-round pick has 28 receptions for 332 yards on the season. Njoku is tied for third in receiving touchdowns among all NFL rookies this season.

RB **Duke Johnson Jr.** leads the team this season in reptions (52) and receiving yards (456), while adding four touchdowns (two rushing and two receiving). Among all NFL running backs since 2015, Johnson ranks first in receiving yards (1,504) and second in receptions (166).

Rookie QB **DeShone Kizer** has thrown for 2,038 yards added 308 rushing yards with five touchdowns. His 308 rushing yards are the second-most by a Browns quarterback in a season and his 2,038 passing yards are the third-most by a Browns rookie.

Cleveland – Hue Jackson: 9-35, third season as head coach, second with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He is in his 30th year as a coaching, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Packers -- Mike McCarthy: 133-80-1, 11th season as head coach. Mike McCarthy was named the 14th head coach in Green Bay Packers history on January 12, 2006. With a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV, he joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title. He has guided the Packers to nine playoff appearances, tied with Lombardi for the team record, including a franchise-best seven straight berths from 2009-15. McCarthy has led the Packers to eight 10-win seasons, five seasons with 11-plus wins and three with 12-plus victories, all franchise records. In 2011, he led Green Bay to a team-record 15 wins, the NFC North title and the top seed in the conference for the first time since 1996. He returned to Green Bay after serving as the team's quarterbacks coach in 1999. He was offensive coordinator for the New Orleans Saints (2000-04) and the San Francisco 49ers (2005).

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

• OL **JC Tretter** was selected by the Packers in the fourth round of the 2013 NFL Draft. He appeared in 35 games for Green Bay from 2014-16 before joining the Browns.

• Packers QB **Joe Callahan** was claimed off waivers by the Browns in October of 2016. **Callahan** spent five weeks with Cleveland but did not appear in a game.

• Packers tight ends coach **Brian Angelichio** served the same role for the Browns from 2014-15.

• Browns from Wisconsin: OL **Joe Thomas** (Brookfield), OL **Kevin Zeitler** (Waukesha) and LB **Joe Schobert** (Waukesha).

• OL **Joe Thomas,** LB **Joe Schobert**, OL **Kevin Zeitler** and DB **Darius Hillary** all played collegiately at the University of Wisconsin.

• Packers C **Corey Linsley** (Boardman), G/T **Adam Pankey** (Hamilton) and LB **Jake Ryan** (Cleveland) are Ohio natives. Linsley also played collegiately at Ohio State.

• Packers defensive coordinator **Dom Capers** began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kent State from 1972-74 and went on to coach defensive backs at Ohio State from 1982-83.

• Packers special teams coordinator **Ron Zook** served as the defensive coordinator for the University of Cincinnati from 1981-82 and later coached defensive backs at Ohio State from 1988-90.

• Packers running backs coach **Ben Sirmans** served the same role at Kent State from 2000-04.

• Packers wide receivers coach **Luke Getsy** began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Akron from 2007-08, where Packers assistant offensive line coach **Jeff Blasko** also served as a graduate assistant from 2008-10.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK **E**

RB Isaiah Crowell

With 100 rushing yards, would record his sixth career 100-yard rushing game and tie him for first on the Browns' 100-yard rushing games list since 1999 (William Green, Peyton Hillis and Jamal Lewis.)

With five yards on the ground, would become the first Brown to rush for at least 600 yards in four consecutive seasons since Greg Pruitt in 1975-78.

RB Matthew Dayes

With a kickoff return of 50 or more yards, would become the first Brown to record three kickoff returns of 50-plus yards since Josh Cribbs did it in 2011.

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

A reception of 25-plus yards would tie him for the most big-play receptions (5) ever recorded by a Browns running back in a single season (Leroy Hoard, 1991).

With 50 receiving yards or more, would be the first Browns running back to record 50-plus receiving yards five times in a single season. It would also tie the fifth-best mark set by an AFC running back in the category since 2000.

With 44 receiving yards, could become the first NFL running back to record 500 receiving yards in each of his first three seasons since Herschel Walker in 1986-88.

Is 94 scrimmage yards away from passing Earnest Byner (2,611, 1984-86) as the Brown with the 10th-most scrimmage yards in his first three NFL seasons.

QB DeShone Kizer

A rushing TD would mark his sixth of the season and would tie Otto Graham (1950, 1953 and 1955) for the second-best total by a Browns quarterback in a single season. It would also tie him for fourth among all NFL rookie quarterbacks in the category since 2000.

Kizer's six rushing TDs would also be the fourth-most by any Browns rookie since 2000.

With 88 rushing yards, would pass Mike Phipps (395, 1973) for first on the Browns' single-season quarterback rushing list.

DB Jason McCourty

An interception would tie his single-season career high of four.

TE David Njoku

A receiving TD would mark his fifth of the season and would tie him for the sixth-best mark ever registered by a Browns tight end in a single season. It would also tie Josh Gordon (2012) for second-highest tally recorded by a Browns rookie since 2000.

The Browns fell to an early 14-point deficit as QB Aaron Rodgers directed TD drives on his first opportunities. Packers TE Jermichael Finley caught a 10-yard touchdown, while rookie RB Eddie Lacy scored on a 1-yard run with 3:44 to play in the first quarter. Cleveland responded in the second quarter as QB Brandon Weeden orchestrated a 12-play, 45-yard drive to set up Billy Cundiff's 46-yard field goal, bringing the score to 14-3 with 5:11 to go in the first half. Green Bay answered on its next possession, with K Mason Crosby booting a 26-yard field goal that provided the Packers a 17-3 halftime advantage. Cleveland cut the deficit to 17-6 in the third quarter following Cundiff's second field goal (44 yards) of the game. The Packers scored a touchdown on the ensuing possession, only for the Browns to respond with a touchdown drive of their own, sparked by WR Travis Benjamin's career-long 86-yard kickoff return. Capitalizing on good field position, Cameron caught a 2-yard touchdown pass from Weeden with 6:09 left in the game, bringing the Browns within 11 points, 24-13. Green Bay sealed the victory as Rodgers found Jarrett Boykin on a 20-yard touchdown pass with 3:44 remaining in the contest.

WR Josh Gordon - Started and played in his first game last week against the Chargers since Dec. 21, 2014...Led the team with four receptions for 85 yards...Activated to the team's 53-man roster after being reinstated on Nov. 30, 2017...Caught 165 passes for 2,839 yards in career...Led the NFL in receiving yards in 2013 with 1,646 on 87 receptions...Originally selected by the Browns in the second round of the 2012 NFL Supplemental Draft.

LT Spencer Drango - Appeared in every game this year with six starts...Replaced an injured Joe Thomas at left tackle during the Titans game in Week 7...Made his first start of the season against the Texans in Week 6 as an extra offensive lineman...Selected by the Browns in the fifth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

LG Joel Bitonio - Started all 43 games he's appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft...Inked a five-year contract extension in March.

C JC Tretter - Started at center in every contest this season... Originally selected by the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round (122nd overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft...Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RG Kevin Zeitler – Started every game this year and has now started 83 of 84 career games...Originally drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft...Joined the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RT Shon Coleman - Made all 12 starts this season...Selected by the Browns in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

TE Randall Telfer – Played in every game and started 11 this season...Caught two passes for 24 yards this year...Selected by the Browns in the sixth round of the 2015 NFL Draft out of USC.

WR Corey Coleman - Started against the Chargers last week... Has led the team in receiving in three of his five games played this season...Totaled 15 receptions for 206 yards and a score on the year... Returned to action in Week 11 after being activated from injured reserve (hand)...Selected by the Browns 15th overall in the 2016 NFL Draft.

QB DeShone Kizer - Completed 181 of 345 passes for 2,038 yards and six TDs this season...Leads the team in rushing TDs with five...Started 11 games this year...Dressed, but did not play Week 6... Was 15 of 32 for 215 passing yards against the Chargers...Added a team-leading 46 rushing yards last week...His 308 rushing yards are the second-most by a Browns quarterback in a season, while his 2,038 passing yards this year are the third-most by a Browns rookie...Drafted by the Browns in the second round (52nd overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft.

RB Isaiah Crowell – Has rushed for a team-leading 595 yards on 155 carries with two TDs this season...Rushed for a season-high 95 yards in Week 12 and moved into eighth place on the Browns all-time rushing list...Became the fifth Browns player and second running back to surpass 3,000 scrimmage yards since 1999 against the Colts in Week 3...Originally came to the Browns as an undrafted free agent out of Alabama State.

FB Danny Vitale – Saw action in every game with four starts this year...Has a team-leading eight special teams tackles...Signed by the Browns off the Buccaneers' practice squad in Week 6 last year...Originally a sixth-round draft pick by Tampa Bay in 2016 out of Northwestern.

Kirby Wilson was named the Browns running backs coach/ run game coordinator in 2016. He has 19 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #12, Adrian Peterson #16 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1.000-vard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. In Wilson's first season in Cleveland, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average. The average was the seventh-best in team history and the team's best mark since 1966.

His 22 career touchdowns are the third-most by a Browns player since 1999 and his 3,628 scrimmage yards rank fourth.

RETURNS FOR DAYES

Rookie RB **Matthew Dayes** returned the opening kickoff 53 yards against Jacksonville (11/19). Dayes also recorded a 71yard kickoff return against the Vikings (10/29), which is the fourth-longest kickoff return in the NFL this season. He is the first Browns player with two 50-plus yard returns in one season since RB **Fozzy Whittaker** in 2013. Dayes joins L.A. Rams WR Pharoh Cooper, New England RB Dion Lewis and Atlanta WR Andre Roberts as the only NFL players with two 50-plus yard kickoff returns this season.

On Tuesday, the NFL celebrated the first-ever "Unboxing Day," when many players showcased their cleats to their team and fans for the first time. OL Zach Banner, WR Sammie Coates, OL Spencer Drango, LB Christian Kirksey, DB Jason McCourty, TE Randall Telfer and FB Danny Vitale unveiled their cleats and spoke about their causes together in the team's equipment room, while QB DeShone Kizer visited UH Rainbow Babies & Children's Hospital and shared the moment with a young patient.

In support of Browns players, Dee and Jimmy Haslam will donate \$5,000 to each player's cause.

Through Browns Give Back on Tuesday, Browns players will visit 18 second-grade students at George Washington Carver School to emphasize education in Cleveland and highlight the team's "Special Teams Package" clothing program, a partnership with Shoes and Clothes for Kids (SC4K) and the Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD) to support school attendance by providing school uniforms, daily clothing items and school supplies.

During their time at George Washington Carver School, Browns players and students will interact and learn during a "Sight Word Boot Camp" game, and where players will hold up sight words for students to spell together while also exercise. The players will read books to students during the visit, as well as help prepare and deliver "Special Teams Packages" to the entire second grade class.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 30 years of coaching experience, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In his first year with Cleveland, he helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie. Third-round pick quarterback Cody Kessler registered the second-highest single-game passing yardage total by a Browns rookie with 336 in Week 6.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green to taled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, , Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. The foundation also focuses its efforts to further awareness, prevention and healing for victims of human trafficking. The foundation's website is www.huejackson.org.

The Cleveland Browns dropped the 2017 season opener to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-18. Despite limiting the Steelers to 290 yards, two touchdown receptions by Steelers TE Jesse James proved to be the difference in the contest. On the game's opening possession. Pittsburgh forced a three-and-out and on fourth down, deep in Browns territory, its special teams unit opened the scoring. LB Tyler Matakevich blocked Britton Colquitt's punt and Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to give the Steelers an early 7-0 advantage. Later in the quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer led the team on a 12-play, 68-yard drive, which he capped off by sneaking into the end zone from a yard out to even the scoring. With 45 seconds left in the first half, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found James in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard score to give Pittsburgh a 14-7 lead heading into the locker room. As Cleveland's defense forced a three-and-out on Pittsburgh's first possession of the second half, Kizer led the offense down the field and set up fellow rookie K Zane Gonzalez, who notched a 24-yard field goal to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 14-10. On the game's next possession, Roethlisberger marched the Steelers 75 yards down the field and connected with James again for his second touchdown reception on the afternoon to extend their lead to 21-10. Late in the fourth quarter, DB Derrick Kindred picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 30 yards to the Cleveland 31-yard line. Later in the quarter, on fourth-and-two from the 3-yard line, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman at the goal line for a touchdown, the first touchdown pass of his career. RB Isaiah Crowell punched in a two-point conversion to cut the lead to 21-18, but Pittsburgh would not let Cleveland get the ball back as they sealed 21-18 victory.

The Cleveland Browns dropped their second game as Baltimore's defense forced five turnovers in a 24-10 Ravens victory. Early in the first quarter, a strip-sack by Ravens LB Terrell Suggs gave Baltimore's offense a short field and a 4-yard TD run by RB Terrence West for a 7-0 lead. Midway through the second quarter, Ravens QB Joe Flacco led Baltimore on a six-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 4-yard TD strike to RB Javorious Allen, extending the lead to 14-0. Replacing injured QB DeShone Kizer, QB Kevin Hogan responded with a five-play, 83-yard drive. Hogan connected with rookie TE David Njoku for a 23-yard TD, the first TD pass of Hogan's career and the first TD recep-tion of Njoku's, to cut the deficit, 14-7. Later in the second quarter, Ravens rookie LB Tyus Bowser intercepted a Hogan pass, resulting in a 27-yard return and a 2-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Jeremy Maclin for a 21-7 Ravens lead at halftime. Midway through the third quarter, rookie K Zane Gonzalez connected on a 38-yard field goal to shrink Baltimore's lead, but Ravens K Justin Tucker converted a 28-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to make the score 24-10. On the game's next possession, Kizer marched the Browns 70 yards down the field before Ravens DB Lardarius Webb intercepted a Kizer pass in the end zone. Cleveland's offense wasn't able to muster any more points as Baltimore's defense sealed the 24-10 victory with a late fourth quarter stand. Early in the first quarter, OL Joe Thomas exceeded 10,000 straight snaps for his career, the longest-known streak in NFL history.

In a Week 3 road contest, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Indianapolis Colts, 31-28. Trailing 7-O early in the second quarter, RB Duke Johnson Jr. avoided a couple would-be tacklers and leaped over the pylon for a 19-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 7-7. On the Colts' ensuing possession, QB Jacoby Brissett spun away from a defender and scampered into the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown to give the Colts a 14-7 advantage. After Browns P Britton Colquitt pinned Indianapolis inside its own 5-yard line, Brissett led the Colts on a five-play, 97-yard drive capped off by a 61-yard touchdown pass to WR T.Y. Hilton to extend their lead to 21-7. Indy would tack on its third score of the quarter as RB Frank Gore found the end zone from four yards out to give the Colts a 28-7 lead. With 44 seconds to play in the half, QB DeShone Kizer linked up with WR Jordan Leslie, who made a one-handed grab for a 26-yard gain down to the Colts' 2-yard line. Two plays later, Kizer found TE David Njoku in the back of the end zone for his second touchdown reception in as many games to cut Indy's lead to 28-14 at the half. After a scoreless third quarter, Colts K Adam Vinatieri notched a 33-yard field goal to extend their lead to 31-14. Later in the fourth, Kizer found WR Kenny Britt for an 11-yard touchdown to make it 31-21. Despite outgaining the Jets 419-212, the Browns fell to New York, 17-14. On the game's opening possession, Browns rookie DL Myles Garrett, who was making his NFL debut, reached Jets OB Josh McCown to record the first sack of his career on his first NFL snap. Garrett would register another sack in the second quarter to become the first No. 1 overall pick to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut. Scoring opportunities plagued the Browns throughout the contest as the team had two red zone turnovers (one fumble and one interception) and two missed field goals. With time winding down in the first half, Jets K Chandler Catanzaro notched a 57-yard field goal to give New York a 3-0 lead at the half. To start the second half, Browns QB Kevin Hogan relieved rookie DeShone Kizer and led the team on a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped by a onehanded touchdown reception by rookie TE David Njoku to give the Browns a 7-3 ad-vantage. Njoku's third touchdown reception of the year tied for the most by a Browns rookie tight end in a single season. Later in the quarter, McCown connected with TE Austin Seferian-Jenkins for a 2-yard score to regain the lead, 10-7. In the final frame, the Jets took over on downs and marched 97 yards down the field as McCown found WR Jermaine Kearse for a 24-yard touchdown to extend their lead to 17-7. Cleveland would tack on another late score as Hogan dumped off a short pass to RB Duke Johnson Jr., who scampered 41 yards to the end zone, to cut New York's lead to 17-14. However, after recovering an onside kick, New York would kneel out the clock to secure the victory.

Despite a game-tying 54-yard field goal with under a minute to play from rookie K Zane Gonzalez, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Tennessee Titans, 12-9, in overtime. In a game that featured seven field goals, Titans K Ryan Succop opened the scor-ing with a 43-yarder to give Tennessee a 3-0 lead after the first quarter. Following a fumble recovery by DB Ibraheim Campbell midway through the second quarter, Gonsalez notched a 31-yarder to tie the game, 3-3. Later in the quarter, Succop answered back with a 23-yard field goal to give the Titans a 6-3 halftime advantage. QB Cody Kessler relieved QB DeShone Kizer in the third quarter and led the team on a 10-play, 70-yard scoring drive, capped by a Gonzalez 47-yard field goal to even the scoring, 6-6. In overtime, following three punts, Succop hit his fourth and final field goal of the game to give Tennessee a 12-9 victory.
