The Detroit Lions (6-6) hit the road for the second-consecutive week as they travel to Tampa Bay to take on the Buccaneers (4-8) in Week 14. Both teams look to rebound this week as Detroit fell to Baltimore 44-20 in Week 13, while the Buccaneers are coming off a 26-20 loss at Green Bay. Sunday's game marks the 57th all-time meeting between the two clubs, with Detroit holding the edge in the all-time series, 30-26-0. The Lions claimed victory in the teams' last meeting (12/7/14) by a score of 34-17 at Ford Field

JIM CALDWELL **Head Coach** Years with Lions: 4 Years as NFL Head Coach: 7 Years in NFL: 17

REACHING 30 WINS

With two playoff appearances in his first three years, Jim Caldwell has established himself as one of the most successful head coaches in recent franchise history. In his 52nd game as the Lions Head Coach (Week 4 at Min; 10/1/17), Caldwell led the team to a 14-7 win at Minnesota and recorded his 30th overall win since joining the Lions in 2014. By reaching 30 career wins > One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season with the club in 52 games, he became the fastest Lions head coach to reach 30 career wins since Head Coach Buddy Parker, who recorded 30 wins in 41 games (1951-54). His overall record > From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and with the Lions stands at 33-27 (.550).

Beginning his football coaching career in 1977 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, the University of Iowa, 2017 marks Caldwell's 40th consecutive season coaching football.

100 CLUB

With a 14-7 win over Minnesota in Week 4 of the 2017 season, After being appointed Ravens offensive coordinator in Caldwell logged his 56th overall win in his 100th career regular season game. His career record as a head coach (33-27 in DET; 26-22 in IND) now stands at 59-49 (.546) in 108 career games.

LIONS FINISH 9-7 IN 2016, EARN PLAYOFF BERTH

The Lions finished the 2016 season with a record of 9-7 and earned the team's second playoff berth in the past three seasons. The last time the Lions made the playoffs twice in a three-year span was 1997 and 1999.

➤ By earning a playoff berth in 2016, Caldwell joins Buddy Parker (1952, 1953) and Bobby Ross (1997, 1999) as the only coaches in Lions history to lead the team to the playoffs twice in their first three seasons with the club.

EIGHT COMEBACK WINS IN 2016

The Lions finished the 2016 season with a record of 9-7. In eight of the team's nine wins, the Lions trailed in the fourth quarter and went on to win the game. Detroit set a new NFL record, surpassing the previous total of seven set by the 2009 Indianapolis Colts (also coached by Jim Caldwell), for the most wins in a season after trailing in the fourth quarter.

COACHING OVERVIEW

> Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.

In 16 previous NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 13 winning seasons and only twice finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 171-97 regular season record, along with 14 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three conference championships and two Super Bowl wins.

➤ As an NFL head coach (six seasons), Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009, 11 with Detroit in 2014). Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Ind and Bal).

➤ In his first year as head coach for IND (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.

wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.

was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).

December 2012, Baltimore went on to win five of its next seven games, including Super Bowl XLVII. During that span, the offense averaged 400.6 yards per game, including an average of 410.3 yards per game during the four playoff wins.

QUINN MAKES HIS MARK



BOB QUINN
Executive Vice President and
General Manager
Years with Lions: 2
Years in NFL: 18

While working for the New England Patriots, he helped contribute to one of the most impressive stretches in NFL history, one that produced four Super Bowl titles, including the most recent championship in 2014 (Super Bowl XLIX). Since 2000, Quinn's first year with New England, the Patriots have won six AFC Championships, 13 AFC East titles, 12+ games in a season 10 times (which includes the past six years) and 10+ games in 14 of his 16 seasons.

FIRST SEASON AT THE HELM

Quinn's first season in the role of a franchise's top football executive culminated in a playoff appearance, and he became the only first-year executive among nine in the NFL to accomplish this feat since the 2013 season. In doing so, Quinn also became the Lions' first general manager to guide the team to the playoffs in his inaugural season since Nick Kerbawy in 1952.

Along with the nearly 40-percent changeover and upgrade to the team's roster that he inherited, Quinn's changes paid dividends in 2016 when the Lions finished 9-7 on the team's

way to the playoffs.

➤ Entering his second season, Quinn's ongoing commitment to improve all aspects of the club's football operations has included restructuring the player personnel department and scouting evaluation processes; renovating the team's weight room and practice fields along with other facility improvements; upgrading the team's football information and video technology; and instituting a comprehensive nutritional program, which included the hiring of a performance dietician for the players.

DRAFTING EXPERTISE

Quinn's initial draft class in 2016 featured the selection of six linemen on offense and defense, the most linemen in a Lions draft since 1989 and the most ever in a seven-round draft. Highlighting last year's draft class was the Lions' first-round selection 1 Taylor Decker, who earned all-rookie honors in 2016. Additionally, DT A'Shawn Robinson and C/G Graham Glasgow would earn starting roles during their rookie seasons. > Of the 12 playoff teams in 2016, no team had members of its draft class play more games (108) than the Detroit Lions.

PATRIOTS PAST

During his time with New England, Quinn served a number of roles in the player personnel department, including most recently as Director of Pro Scouting from 2012-15. While he worked as Director of Pro Scouting, the Patriots won the 2014 Super Bowl and four-straight AFC East Division championships.

From 2009-2012, Quinn was the Assistant Director of Pro Personnel. For the previous nine years, Quinn worked in several different capacities within the Patriots player personnel department, including roles in college scouting as a National Scout and Regional Scout. He played an integral role in evaluating and procuring talent for the team through the NFL draft process, free agency, trades, etc.

WHAT THEY SAID

The following are post-game quote sheets from the Lions' 44-20 Week 13 loss at Baltimore.

HEAD COACH JIM CALDWELL

On the loss at Baltimore in Week 13: "It wasn't pretty. I didn't do a very good job. We just didn't do a very good job - starting with missed field goals. A couple drops here LINEBACKER JARRAD DAVIS and miscues in scoring territory. We fought our way back in it. The third quarter was a pretty hot quarter for us. Our defense was stopping people. Our offense was moving the ball. We get within one score, and then the bottom falls out. I just have to do a better job."

On if this team is good enough to be a playoff contender: "We've got to play better than we played today, that's for certain. That's all I'm concerned about, is how we play. We've got to put together some consistent football, and we have not done that consistently. We may come back, got wins in certain places here and there, but not consistent enough."

On RB Tion Green's NFL debut: "He ran pretty well, and he had some pretty good runs. He made some tough runs. The touchdown run was a very good run, and he had a pretty nice game there coming off the left side. He did some nice things, got his shoulders square. I thought he did well. We'll look at it further, but I thought he did well."

On what happened defensively in the game: "[Ravens WR Mike] Wallace got loose on the one, which, obviously, he's one of those guys that can take the top off your defense if you're not in position to make plays. He's going to catch it and give you some problems. We didn't do a good job of covering the deep portion of the field. That's something that we just have to get better at."

On using DB Quandre Diggs at safety: "He's smart. He adjusts and can solve any problems for you. Obviously, he can thump. He's a guy that gets himself in position to make plays. That's why we put him in that spot."

QUARTERBACK MATTHEW STAFFORD

On the team's slow starts: "We just need to execute better. We work on it in practice all the time. We were down 20-0 at the end of the half and fought tooth and nail to get back into this game. I thought we were in a position to win it, but we didn't get it done."

On his team-record 20-straight completions against the Ravens: "I had no idea that I had completed that many in a row. I knew that I had completed a lot of them, but with 20 I wasn't even thinking about a streak. That's a really good defense we played today. They are very tough."

On his two long completions to WR Marvin Jones Jr.: "It's not easy to make those kind of plays, but I have a lot of confidence in him. He does a great job going up and getting the ball and he's great at fighting for it. He even caught one pass on a pass interference penalty, which is tough to do."

On if the Ravens loss was self-inflicted: "You play a good team, and they come out and do what they have to do, then at the end of the day, you get frustrated. It's almost like when you lose, you start beating yourself up in a lot of areas. We were just burning the candle at both ends and put ourselves in bad situations today. We didn't execute the way we needed to."

On the team's struggles the last two games: "Stopping the run was a big thing for us coming into the game. We kind of did that to start off, but then they got on us in the second half. We've got to continue to get a grasp on that."

On the feeling of needing to make plays to win: "At the end of the day, no matter what the offense does, we're just as important on this team, too. We have to go out, make stops and put them in a good situation, too. They're going to make mistakes, and we're going to make mistakes. We expect them to back us up when we make mistakes, just like they expect us to back them up when they make mistakes. It's a team game. No matter what they do, we have to go out and do what we do, and if we don't do that, things like today will happen."

WIDE RECEIVER GOLDEN TATE

On the slow start at Baltimore: "It seems as if it's selfinflicted. Against good teams like this, good defenses, you just don't have room to make those mistakes. If one guy makes a mistake, we can't have that. We've got to figure something out."

On ways to correct the issues in recent games: "Typically, over the years, we've done well late in the season. We had been playing with a lot of confidence and finding ways to get wins, but we don't have that feeling this year. It's clearly not happening for us right now. We've got to keep working, keep grinding. It sucks. During the week, I think we execute decently. There's things that we could clean up, but it is what it is. We've got to find a way to come out and start quickly. We have what it takes to be a really, really good team and beat teams week-in and week-out, but we just don't right now. It's frustrating."





WHAT THEY SAID

On the season moving forward: "We've got to get this Active Roster Only together. We've still got games and a lot can happen. There's been crazier things that have happened, but we've got to get Player this thing popping."

TIGHT END MICHAEL ROBERTS

On the loss at Baltimore: "As an offense. I know we've got to start fast, and that was the goal all week. But, we didn't Eric Ebron start fast, so we beat ourselves today. Each loss we've had, Kasim Edabali I feel as if we've beat ourselves. I can't really say why this **Tion** Green happened. The process just has to get better. I just take it play by play. The big picture to me just kind of makes everything jumbled. I'm just trying to get ready for that play. that moment."

On if he feels this team is a playoff team: "This team is definitely a playoff team. We talk about it every week. It's just handling our business. Obviously, we need to do great from Teez Tabor here on out to give ourselves a chance. We'll be working."

On his increased action at Baltimore: "I should've scored. Anthony Zettel I'm a little mad about that one. But, anything that can help my team to set up a score."

SAFETY GLOVER OUIN

On the communication issues on defense: "That's something we have to do better at. When subbing or not subbing, there's different personnel and groups, so whatever's going on, we have to be on top of it. If we don't have time to sub, we can't sub. We've got to figure it out. There seems to be one or two plays like that every week where something happens, so we've got to figure it out."

On correcting the team's issues over the last few games: "We've got to score. We've got to get wins. We've just got to execute. We've got to do the things that we're supposed to do. We've just got to play better football."

In the fourth quarter at Baltimore, LB **Nick Bellore** scored his first career touchdown on a one-yard touchdown pass. He is the first defensive player in the NFL catch a touchdown pass since Texans DE J.J. Watt vs. Tennessee November 20, 2014 and the first linebacker since Chiefs LB Mike Vrabel at Houston October 17, 2010. Bellore is the first Lions defensive player to record a touchdown reception in a game since LB Ed O'Neil scored on a 32-yard fake field goal vs. Atlanta September 19, 1976.

With a blocked PAT and field goal in Week 12 vs. Minnesota (11/23), the game marked the first time the Lions blocked two place kicks in the same game since blocking two field goals vs. Seattle September 10, 2006. The Lions have now blocked two field goals and one PAT this season, which is the first time the team has recorded at least one blocked PAT and FG in the same season since 2004.

VIDEO BOARDS

In each end zone, the Daktronics main video displays are more than twice the size of the current displays and measure 39.5 feet high by 152 feet wide. Flanking the main displays will be four additional displays measuring 13 feet high by 59 feet wide that can be used individually or coordinated with the main displays for one continuous 270-foot presentation to show live video, instant replays, statistics, graphics and animations, and sponsorship messages.





THE SNAPPING STANDARD

Muhlbach has served as one of the most critical pieces to the Lions field goal unit since he began long snapping for the Lions during the 2004 season (Week 10 at Jacksonville 11/14/04). He has snapped on 53 successful attempts from 50+ yards, which is the highest total by a long snapper since 2000. Agnew's 88-yard punt return touchdown was the fifthlongest punt return in Lions history and the longest since WR Reggie Swinton returned a punt 89 yards for a touchdown at Carolina December 21, 2003.

RB Barry Sanders made history in Detroit's 27-9 win over the Buccaneers at Tampa Bay on October 12, 1997. He became the first player in NFL history to record two 80-yard TD runs in the same game. He broke off an 80-yard scoring play late in the first quarter and added an 82-yard touchdown romp in the third quarter, finishing the day with 215 yards.

The Lions ended a 26-game road losing streak on December 29, 2010 when they claimed a 23-20 overtime win at Tampa Bay.

In the 2011 season opener, the Lions claimed a 27-20 win on the road behind 305 passing yards and 3 TDs by QB Matthew Stafford and 2 TD grabs by WR Calvin Johnson.

With a 34-17 victory over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the teams most recent meeting in 2014, the Lions claimed their ninth victory in the season's first 13 games and improved to 9-4, marking Detroit's best record through 13 games since 1991 (9-4).

The Lions started the season with a victory over Arizona in the season-opener 35-23. Both teams exchanged turnovers on their opening drives of the season, soon after Lions S Tayon Wilson's interception. Lions QB Matthew Stafford threw an interception on Detroit's first possession caught by Cardinals CB Justin Bethel who would return it 82 yards for a touchdown, putting the Cardinals up 7-0. Cardinals K Phil Dawson would later convert on a 24-yard field goal attempt, making it 10-0. After a few stalled drives from both teams, the Lions would get their first touchdown of the season, which was set up nicely by S Glover Quin's interception. Just before time expired in the first half, Lions K Matt Prater knocked through a 58-yard field goal putting the score at 10-9 going into halftime. Out of the half, it was Arizona scored first following an impressive 94yard drive from the Cardinals offense, as RB Kerwynn Williams took a handoff from Palmer up the middle for a 3-yard score, making it 17-9. However, the Lions defense once again would step up for the Lions, as DT A'Shawn Robinson would force a fumble while bringing down Cardinals RB David Johnson. The Lions made good on their opportunity, as Matthew Stafford found RB Theo Riddick in the middle of the field for a 7-yard touchdown to finish off a drive that took the Lions only two plays and 45 seconds to complete, closing the score to 17-15 in favor of the Cardinals. The Detroit Lions improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2011 after defeating the New York Giants 24-10 at MetLife Stadium on Monday Night Football. The first score of the game came after both offenses exchanged stalled drives, as QB Matthew Stafford was able to lead his offense down the field 54 yards to set up a 27-yard touchdown strike to WR Marvin Jones Jr. On the very next drive, Giants QB Eli Manning drove down the field for a score, leading his offense to an 8-play, 75-yard drive capped off by an 19-yard touchdown pass to rookie TE Evan Engram to tie things up at 7-7 at the start off the second quarter. The teams then exchanged turnovers on back-to-back plays. A Stafford fumble gave the Giants possession of the ball, but Lions LB Tahir Whitehead was able to pick off a Manning pass intended for Engram on the ensuing possession. The Lions were then able to take advantage of the short field in front of them, as Stafford found the end zone for the second time of the night, this time connecting with TE Eric Ebron on a 7-yard touch pass to put the Lions up 14-7 with 8:43 left in the second quarter. With :30 seconds left in the first half, K Matt Prater was able to knock a 56-yard field goal off the bottom post, giving the Lions the 17-7 lead into halftime. The Giants struck first in the second half, as K Aldrick Rosas connected on a 25-yard attempt, capping off a 10 play, 68-yard drive and cutting the Lions' lead down to 17-10 with 4:58 left in the third quarter. The final scoring play of the game was generated off of special teams, as Lions rookie CB Jamal Agnew returned a Brad Wing punt 88-yards for a Lions touchdown, increasing the lead to 24-10 with 12:56 remaining in the fourth quarter. Agnew became the first player in Lions history to return a punt for a touchdown on Monday Night Football.

The Detroit Lions dropped to 2-1 on the year after their 30-26 loss to the Falcons. Atlanta scored first, driving 75 yards on the opening drive for a WR Mohamed Sanu four-yard touchdown. With 3:01 left in the third quarter, Roethlisberger found WR JuJu Smith-Schuster for a 97-yard touchdown, upping the Steelers lead to 20-12. On the ensuing Lions drive, Prater would make his fifth field goal attempt of the game, a 19-yard attempt, pulling the Steelers back to a five-point lead at 20-15, a lead they would hold on to until the end of regulation.
