CAROLINA PANTHERS (10-4) vs. TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS (4-10)

PANTHERS CLOSE REGULAR SEASON HOME SLATE WITH TAMPA BAY

CAROLINA vs. TAMPA BAY

The Carolina Panthers will enter the regular season home finale on a two-game winning streak as Carolina has won six of its last seven games. The Panthers have a chance to clinch a playoff berth with a win over Tampa Bay.

Carolina dispatched the NFC North-leading Vikings and then held on to beat the Green Bay Packers in Aaron Rodgers' return from injury. In the two games, the Panthers totaled seven takeaways, including five interceptions. Offensively, the team has rushed for over 100 yards in eight straight games, and leads the NFL with 165.9 rushing yards per game over that stretch.

Against the Packers, quarterback Cam Newton threw for 242 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions. It marked the second time this season that Newton has thrown for four touchdowns. Christian McCaffrey had a career-best 136 total yards from scrimmage as he caught his fifth touchdown reception of the season. He became the first rookie running back in NFL history with at least 70 receptions and five receiving touchdowns.

Greg Olsen also had his best game since returning from injured reserve, making nine catches for 116 yards and a touchdown.

Tampa Bay heads to Carolina after missing a potential game-tying field goal as time expired on Monday night against Atlanta. Jameis Winston threw for 299 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions for a passer rating of 130.5. Mike Evans had 79 yards receiving and a touchdown.

The Panthers defeated the Buccaneers, 17-3, in the teams' first meeting at Tampa Bay in October.

TAMPA, Fla. - Points were at a premium as the Carolina Panthers defense kept the Tampa Bay Buccaneers out of the end zone and came up with three takeaways to spearhead a 17-3 victory. All season long, Rivera has stressed the importance of starting fast. After not scoring a touchdown in the first quarter since the opener at San Francisco, Carolina ended the drought. The Panthers had to convert on third down five times, but ultimately running back Jonathan Stewart took flight over the offensive line to cap off the 17 play, 82-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown rush – his first rushing touchdown of the season. The Panthers added a second touchdown in the fourth quarter. Quarterback Cam Newton followed his 20-yard scamper - the longest rush of the day - with a 25-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin on third down. The 6-foot-5 receiver boxed out rookie cornerback Justin Evans to reel in the jump ball for his second touchdown of the season. The defense took over from there. The unit received criticism entering the game for the lack of takeaways this year, but nearly matched their season total Sunday. The defense forced three turnovers – two interceptions and one fumble. Defensive end Julius Peppers started the day tallying sack No. 151 while forcing a fumble that safety Kurt Coleman recovered in the second quarter. In the fourth quarter, safety Mike Adams and Kuechly – who returned after missing one game – each intercepted quarterback Jameis Winston. As a whole, the defense solidified its standing as one of the best in the league, limiting the Buccaneers to 279 yards of total offense – a season low for Tampa Bay and on par with Carolina's average. In between the touchdowns, Graham Gano added a 28-yard field goal. Questionable entering the game, Gano and is now 16-of-17 this season.

THE HEAD COACHES



Ron RIVERA

NFL: 21st season

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In six seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner. In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak, beginning in 2014, was the longest in NFC history. In 2013, Rivera guided Carolina to its first playoff appearance in 2008 and in 2014, he led the Panthers to the team's first playoff win since 2005.

Before joining the Panthers in 2011, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI.

Rivera is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

An All-American at the University of California, Rivera finished his career as the school's all-time leader in sacks with 22 and tackles with 336.

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., he and his wife, Stephanie, have two children – Christopher and Courtney.

Named the 11th head coach in franchise history on January 15, 2016, after serving as the offensive coordinator in 2015. In 2016, his first year as an NFL head coach, Koetter led Tampa Bay to a 9-7 record – the team's most wins since 2010 and the second-most wins by any coach in their first season with the Buccaneers.

Over the past two seasons, Tampa Bay has posted consecutive seasons with at least 5,500 yards of offense and 340 points for the first time in franchise history. In addition, Jameis Winston became the youngest player in NFL history with 50 touchdown passes. Koetter was previously the offensive coordinator with the Atlanta Falcons (2012-14) and Jacksonville Jaguars (2007-2011).

He played quarterback at Idaho State (1978-1981), helping the team to a Division I-AA national championship as a senior. He coached at Highland High School in his hometown of Pocatello, Idaho, winning a 1984 state championship. He coached collegiately at San Francisco State (1985), Texas-El Paso (1986-88), Missouri (1989-1993), Boston College (1994-95), and Oregon (1996-97), before being named head coach at Boise State (1998-2000) and Arizona State (2001-06).

He was born on February 5, 1959 in Pocatello, Idaho. He and his wife, Kim, have two daughters, Kaylee and Kendra, and two sons, Derek and Davis.

DECEMBER SUCCESS

The Carolina Panthers have been one of the NFL's best teams when the temperatures drop and seasons are at stake in December.

In 31 December games for Jonathan Stewart since 2008, he has averaged 79.8 rush yards per game and totaled 17 rushing touchdowns. He ranks third in total rush yards in regular season games in December since 2008.

In 28 December games for Cam Newton since 2011, he ranks second in the NFL with a 3.78 TD/INT ratio (53 TD 14 INT), while his 53 passing touchdowns are second in the NFL in that stretch.

The Panthers rank second in the NFL in wins in the month of December since 2011, tied with Green Bay and trailing New England by just one win.

PROTECTIVE CAM

Over the last seven games, Cam Newton has helped Carolina go 6-1 not only with his positive production on the ground and through the air, but also by limiting negative plays.

Over that stretch, Newton has only thrown two interceptions, including a four-game streak where he didn't throw any. Carolina's two interceptions are the fewest by any NFL team over the last seven games. Over the first seven games, Newton threw 10 interceptions, tied for 30th in the NFL over that stretch.

Combined with an improving offensive line, Newton has been able to avoid the rush. In the last seven games, Newton has only been sacked nine times, a mark that ranks fifth in the NFL. Over the first seven games, Newton was sacked 22 times which ranked 23rd.

INDIVIDUAL MILESTONES APPROACHING

The Panthers have a number of statistical milestones on the horizon.

NEWTON MOVES UP RECORD BOOK

Cam Newton ran for 58 yards and completed 20-of-31 passes for 242 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions.

Newton had four touchdown passes for the second time this season and sixth time in his career. Newton became the first player since at least 1950 with at least two games of four passing touchdowns and 50+ rushing yards in the same season.

With his 58 rushing yards, Newton now has 643 rushing yards this season. Newton (4) and Michael Vick (4) are the only quarterbacks in NFL history with four seasons of 600 or more rushing yards.

Newton now has 28,943 total yards (rushing and passing) as he passes Matt Ryan (28,866) for second-most total yards through a quarterback's first seven seasons. Only Peyton Manning (30,062) has more.

THIEVES COME BACK FOR MORE

One game after Panthers cornerbacks Daryl Worley and James Bradberry made their first interceptions of the season, the pair each made interceptions against Aaron Rodgers a week later.

Combined with an interception from safety Colin Jones, Carolina tallied three interceptions against Rodgers, his most in a game since 2009.

Bradberry also forced a fumble in the fourth quarter that sealed the victory. Carolina has forced seven takeaways in the last two games.

OLSEN COMES BACK BIG

Greg Olsen had his best game since coming off injured reserve on 11/26 against the Jets. Olsen finished with nine catches for 116 yards and a touchdown. It marked his first 100-yard receiving game since 10/10/16 against Tampa Bay.

Olsen became the fifth different player with a 100-yard receiving game for Carolina, a number that ranks first in the NFL and is a new franchise record.

Olsen moved into seventh place all-time in receiving yards (7,519) by a tight end, and is in a tie for 10th place all-time in receiving touchdowns (53).

McCAFFREY SETS NEW NFL MARK

Christian McCaffrey set a new career high with 136 total yards from scrimmage. He finished with a team-high 63 rushing yards and caught six passes for 73 yards and one touchdown.

McCaffrey tied Kelvin Benjamin for the franchise record for receptions by a rookie with 73 catches. He already holds franchise records for most receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns by a running back.

He also became the NFL's first rookie running back with at least 70 receptions and five receiving touchdowns in a season.

STEWART PASSES 7,000 ON THE GROUND

With 68 yards in Week Four at New England (10/1/17), running back Jonathan Stewart became the Panthers all-time leading rusher, surpassing the previous record of 6,846 yards by DeAngelo Williams from 2006-14. Stewart topped 7,000 with a 110-yard game against Miami on Monday Night Football. He now has 7,299 rushing yards in his career, which ranks eighth in the NFL since he began his career in 2008.

Stewart is the only currently active player who is the all-time leading rusher for his current team.

NEWTON IS PANTHERS QB WINS LEADER

In Week Four at New England (10/1/17), quarterback Cam Newton earned his 54th career victory as a starter, setting a franchise record for wins by a quarterback.

In that game, Newton totaled four touchdowns (three passing and one rushing). It was Newton's 36th career game with at least one rushing touchdown and at least one passing touchdown.

RUNNING AND RUNNING AND RUNNING

This season, Cam Newton has rushed for 643 yards on just 114 attempts for a rushing average of 5.64 per carry. That average is close to a career high for Newton (5.83, 2012). His season high for rushing yards was 741 in 2012.

Newton has two rushes over 60 yards this season: a 69-yarder against Miami (11/13) and a 62-yarder against Minnesota (12/10). He is the only quarterback in NFL history with two runs over 60 yards in the same season.

Newton has tallied five rushing touchdowns this season. He is the only player with at least five rushing touchdowns in all seven seasons since 2011, and is the first player since Adrian Peterson (2007-13) with a seven-year streak of five rushing touchdowns each season.

Newton leads all quarterbacks in terms of rushing yardage (643), longest rush (69), rushing attempts (114), rushing first downs (39) and second in rushing touchdowns (5).

TWO TIGHT ENDS OVER 100

The Carolina Panthers became the first team this season with a pair of tight ends to both sport 100-yard receiving games. Greg Olsen caught nine passes for 116 yards against Green Bay in Week 15, while Ed Dickson caught five passes for 175 yards at Detroit in Week 5.

The last season a team had two tight ends with 100-yard games were the New England Patriots last year with Martellus Bennett and Rob Gronkowski.

This marks the first time that the Panthers have ever had two different tight ends with 100-yard receiving games in the same season.

RUSHING GAME AMPED UP

Through the season's first eight weeks, Carolina ranked 20th in the NFL in rushing. The team has now rushed for over 100 yards in eight straight games, and leads the NFL with 165.9 rushing yards per game over that stretch. The Panthers are now ranked fourth in the NFL in rushing yards per game (135.7).

Carolina is one of two teams in the NFL with three or more 200-yard rushing games. It is the Panthers first season since 2009 with three 200-yard rushing games. The franchise record is four games, set in 2008.

Stewart (661), Newton (643) and McCaffrey (382) lead the Panthers in rushing. No NFL teams currently have three players with over 400 yards rushing.

The last time that Carolina had three players with over 400 rushing yards was in 2011 (Williams-Stewart-Newton).

RED HOT AND IN THE ZONE

After struggling to find the end zone earlier in the season, the Panthers offense has been strong inside the red zone over the last five games. Since Carolina's win over Miami in Week 10, the Panthers have scored 13 touchdowns on 17 trips to the red zone for a TD percentage of 76.47, second in the NFL over that stretch.

Carolina has been efficient at scoring points right before halftime, especially when receiving the kick to start the second half.

The Panthers have scored touchdowns in three of the last six games right before halftime, with one at New Orleans coming in the play before the two-minute warning.

On the season, Carolina ranks sixth in the NFL in total points scored in the final two minutes of the second quarter with 42 points. The Panthers are tied for third in the NFL with five touchdowns in that time period.

Against Atlanta (11/5), the Panthers scored two touchdowns in the last two minutes before half, marking a new franchise record.

Carolina is 9-0 this season when leading at the half.

Carolina has won the coin toss in nine games this season, deferring to the second half each time and posting a record of 8-1 when receiving the second-half kickoff.

The Panthers lead the NFL in points (38) off drives that start the third quarter.

He led the NFL in tackles in 2012 and 2014. In 2012, he became the first rookie since San Francisco's Patrick Willis in 2007 to lead the NFL in tackles.

Kuechly has the most tackles over any six-year stretch in the NFL since London Fletcher had 827 between 2008-13.

After film review, Panthers' coaches have credited Kuechly with 910 career tackles, the third-most in team history.

This season, Kuechly has a team-high 111 tackles despite missing a full game with a concussion. He is the only player in franchise history with more than 100 tackles in each of his first six seasons as a Panther.

Kuechly has racked up his tackle totals by owning three of the top five single-season tackle totals in team history, including a team-record 205 stops as a rookie in 2012. Kuechly led the team in tackles in each of his first four seasons (2012-15).

Since 2012, Gano's 656 points rank eighth in the NFL.



Kicker Graham Gano set a career high with 16 points vs. San Francisco (9/18/16) last season.

Graham Gano is first in the NFL in field goal accuracy (min. 10 attempts), hitting on 25-of-26 tries for 96.2 percent. His only miss came from 55 yards away.

Gano is on pace to set the Panthers single-season record for field goal percentage. The previous record was 92.85 (26-of-28) set by Joe Nedney in 2000.

GANO SETS TOUCHBACK RECORD

In Week Four at New England (10/1/17), kicker Graham Gano had a streak of 15 consecutive kickoffs resulting in touchbacks to start the 2017 season broken on his third kickoff of the game when New England's Dion Lewis returned a Gano kickoff from the New England 3-yard line to the 26-yard line.

The streak of 15 consecutive kickoffs resulting in touchbacks is the longest such streak in the NFL to start a season since at least 1970. Gano held the previous long streak with 14 to start the 2013 season.

GANO IS A FIELD POSITION WEAPON

In addition to his field goal abilities, kicker Graham Gano has been important in the field position game. Since the start of 2013, Gano is second in the NFL with a 75.7 touchback percentage (min. 100 kickoffs).

In 2016, Gano ranked third in the NFL with 74.1 percent of his kickoffs (63-of-85) resulting in touchbacks. In 2014, Gano placed 61 of his 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. The 77.2 percent touchback rate was best in the League and his 61 kickoffs were the most in the NFC.

In 2013, 63 of Gano's 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. His 79.7 touchback percentage was the top mark in the NFL and the highest percentage in a season since Brad Daluiso in 1992 (81.3 percent).

Punter Michael Palardy has put together a fantastic season after winning a training camp punting competition with incumbent veteran Andy Lee.

In the 2017 season opener at San Francisco (9/10/17), Palardy posted a then-career-best 48.7 net average on three punts, the second-best net punting average in a Panthers season opener since Jason Baker (51.0) at St. Louis (9/9/07).

At Tampa Bay, he had four punts over 50 yards and a career-best four punts inside the 20-yard line, including three inside the 10. He followed that up with three more inside the 20 and two inside the 10 against Atlanta.

Palardy uncorked a career-long 63-yard punt at New York (11/27/17).

Over weeks 8-12, he led the NFL in net average and was fifth in punts inside the 20.

Palardy currently ranks seventh in the league in net punting average (42.3).
