#### SERIES INFORMATION

The Detroit Lions (8-7) conclude the 2017 regular season with a home matchup against the Green Bay Packers (7-8) at Ford Field. Detroit fell to Cincinnati 26-17 in Week 16, while Green Bay is coming off a 16-0 loss against Minnesota. Sunday's game marks the 175th all-time meeting between the division rivals, with Green Bay holding the edge in the series, 98-69-7. The two teams last met in Week 9 when the Lions defeated the Packers 30-17 at Lambeau Field.

# CALDWELL'S FOURTH SEASON IN DETROIT



## JIM CALDWELL

Head Coach  
Years with Lions: 4  
Years as NFL Head Coach: 7  
Years in NFL: 17

### REACHING 30 WINS

With two playoff appearances in his first three years, Jim Caldwell has established himself as one of the most successful head coaches in recent franchise history. In his 52nd game as the Lions Head Coach (Week 4 at Min; 10/1/17), Caldwell led the team to a 14-7 win at Minnesota and recorded his 30th overall win since joining the Lions in 2014. By reaching 30 career wins with the club in 52 games, he became the fastest Lions head coach to reach 30 career wins since Head Coach Buddy Parker, who recorded 30 wins in 41 games (1951-54). **His overall record with the Lions stands at 35-28 (.555).**

Beginning his football coaching career in 1977 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, the University of Iowa, 2017 marks Caldwell's 40th consecutive season coaching football.

### 100 CLUB

With a 14-7 win over Minnesota in Week 4 of the 2017 season, Caldwell logged his 56th overall win in his 100th career regular season game. His career record as a head coach (35-28 in DET; 26-22 in IND) now stands at 61-50 (.549) in 111 career games.

### LIONS FINISH 9-7 IN 2016, EARN PLAYOFF BERTH

The Lions finished the 2016 season with a record of 9-7 and earned the team's second playoff berth in the past three seasons. The last time the Lions made the playoffs twice in a three-year span was 1997 and 1999.

➤ By earning a playoff berth in 2016, Caldwell joins Buddy Parker (1952, 1953) and Bobby Ross (1997, 1999) as the only coaches in Lions history to lead the team to the playoffs twice in their first three seasons with the club.

### EIGHT COMEBACK WINS IN 2016

The Lions finished the 2016 season with a record of 9-7. In eight of the team's nine wins, the Lions trailed in the fourth quarter and went on to win the game. **Detroit set a new NFL record, surpassing the previous total of seven set by the 2009 Indianapolis Colts (also coached by Jim Caldwell), for the most wins in a season after trailing in the fourth quarter.**

### COACHING OVERVIEW

- Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.
- In 16 previous NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 13 winning seasons and only twice finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 173-98 regular season record, along with 14 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three conference championships and two Super Bowl wins.
- As an NFL head coach (six seasons), Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009, 11 with Detroit in 2014). Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Ind and Bal).
- In his first year as head coach for IND (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.
- One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.
- From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).
- After being appointed Ravens offensive coordinator in December 2012, Baltimore went on to win five of its next seven games, including Super Bowl XLVII. During that span, the offense averaged 400.6 yards per game, including an average of 410.3 yards per game during the four playoff wins.

## QUINN MAKES HIS MARK



**BOB QUINN**  
Executive Vice President and  
General Manager  
Years with Lions: 2  
Years in NFL: 18

➤ While working for the New England Patriots, he helped contribute to one of the most impressive stretches in NFL history, one that produced **four Super Bowl titles, including the most recent championship in 2014 (Super Bowl XLIX). Since 2000, Quinn's first year with New England, the Patriots have won six AFC Championships, 13 AFC East titles, 12+ games in a season 10 times (which includes the past six years) and 10+ games in 14 of his 16 seasons.**

### FIRST SEASON AT THE HELM

Quinn's first season in the role of a franchise's top football executive culminated in a playoff appearance, and he became the only first-year executive among nine in the NFL to accomplish this feat since the 2013 season. In doing so, Quinn also became the Lions' first general manager to guide the team to the playoffs in his inaugural season since Nick Kerbawy in 1952.

- Along with the nearly 40-percent changeover and upgrade to the team's roster that he inherited, Quinn's changes paid dividends in 2016 when the Lions finished 9-7 on the team's way to the playoffs.
- Entering his second season, Quinn's ongoing commitment to improve all aspects of the club's football operations has included restructuring the player personnel department and scouting evaluation processes; renovating the team's weight room and practice fields along with other facility improvements; upgrading the team's football information and video technology; and instituting a comprehensive nutritional program, which included the hiring of a performance dietician for the players.

### DRAFTING EXPERTISE

Quinn's initial draft class in 2016 featured the selection of six linemen on offense and defense, the most linemen in a Lions draft since 1989 and the most ever in a seven-round draft. Highlighting last year's draft class was the Lions' first-round selection T **Taylor Decker**, who earned all-rookie honors in 2016. Additionally, DT **A'Shawn Robinson** and C/G **Graham Glasgow** would earn starting roles during their rookie seasons.

- *Of the 12 playoff teams in 2016, no team had members of its draft class play more games (108) than the Detroit Lions.*

### PATRIOTS PAST

During his time with New England, Quinn served a number of roles in the player personnel department, including most recently as Director of Pro Scouting from 2012-15. While he worked as Director of Pro Scouting, the Patriots won the 2014 Super Bowl and four-straight AFC East Division championships.

- From 2009-2012, Quinn was the Assistant Director of Pro Personnel. For the previous nine years, Quinn worked in several different capacities within the Patriots player personnel department, including roles in college scouting as a National Scout and Regional Scout. He played an integral role in evaluating and procuring talent for the team through the NFL draft process, free agency, trades, etc.

## WHAT THEY SAID

*The following are post-game quote sheets from the Detroit Lions' Week 16 game at Cincinnati.*

### HEAD COACH JIM CALDWELL

**On the loss at Cincinnati:** "We were struggling today. That's the fact of the matter. They did a better job controlling the line of scrimmage on us. They ran the ball well. They had a couple sparks here and there, but we just were not sharp. We had a few plays here and there, but they played better."

**On why he thinks they were not sharper with so much on the line:** "Every game's on the line. Last two weeks they've been on the line. Obviously, in terms of how we've played, we've played decently I think a couple weeks in a row, just didn't play well today."

**On why he did not trust his offense on many fourth and short situations:** "I mean, earlier in the game you're talking about, I think we were up in one situation. There was another that was fourth and two or something close, but we got down to it, and we knew we obviously had to go after it, and we went after it. And our guys came through, and took it down the field and scored, but you just make a decision on that. You don't get into that situation, and obviously it turns into a different game where it doesn't have to be at that particular point in time. So, you have to wait and measure those things out."

**On how being down three starters on the offensive line affected the offense:** "Yeah, really shouldn't affect it at all, you know, I don't care who we have in there. Doesn't really matter, you've never heard me make an excuse in any situation and I'm not going to start today. We just got to play better, we got to get better. That's why we have 53 men on the roster, that's why you have 10 practice squad guys. Those guys have to be able to step up and play for you. We didn't play as well as we'd like to."

### QUARTERBACK MATTHEW STAFFORD

**On if the game felt like a struggle from start to finish:** "Yeah. We didn't play well. We weren't moving the chains enough, weren't making enough big plays. If you don't do those things on the road, it's tough to win."

**On why the offense struggled so much with so much on the line:** "It's an NFL football game, and sometimes it's not going to be easy. You have to go out there and battle. For some reason or another, we didn't score enough points, and that will cost you."

**On how the offensive line played despite missing three starters:** "Those guys battled and played well. We have to make plays on the outside; that is how you score points in this league."

**On missing the playoffs and not being able to get over the hump:** "We have been to the playoffs before, so I don't know about not getting over the hump. It's not fun when you get eliminated. It's not fun. We put a lot of work into it. My teammates and coaches and everybody put a lot of work into it, so when it doesn't happen – it's disappointing."

### SAFETY GLOVER QUIN

**On Bengals RB Gio Bernard's big game and not being able to slow him down:** "He had a couple of breakout runs and screens. We just didn't do a good enough job executing. We didn't tackle well and we didn't make enough plays."

**On what went wrong on defense:** "It's very frustrating. We didn't make enough plays to win the game. We didn't stop the run and they controlled the line of scrimmage. When you aren't able to do those things, you lose ball games."

### WIDE RECEIVER MARVIN JONES JR.

**On where the team fell short against Cincinnati:** "We didn't execute. There were a few times where we had some success but when it matters most you have to cash in and we didn't do that and they did."

**On what it would have meant for the team to get a win:** "It would mean a lot. Had we won we're still in. We lost, so we're out and that's tough. We need to come with it for the next game and play lights out. We laid an egg out there today and we have to come back."



## WHAT THEY SAID

**On what it means to him to hit 1,000 receiving yards this season:** "It really doesn't mean anything right now. After the season I'll look back at my accomplishments. I needed 30 yards – I would've hit it anyway."

**On how to keep focus heading into next week:** "We're all professionals and we're passionate for the game. We'll all go out there and play like we need to play. We have a game left and this is what we do. We have to go out on a good note. We all have to go and practice with energy and have to be full of energy come Sunday."

### LINEBACKER TAHIR WHITEHEAD

**On what went wrong against the Bengals:** "We didn't capitalize. We didn't play the greatest ball today."

**On not being able to get stops late in the game:** "We got a few penalties late in the game and those made a huge difference. They just kind of bled us out. They were running well in the end. That's credit to them, but I believe we could've played better ball."

**On the mood in the locker room after the game:** "We know we could've played better but we didn't do enough to get it done."

**On knowing the team is eliminated from playoff contention:** "There's a lot of mental pride in this locker room. The season isn't over. We still have one more game and we have to go out there and make it happen."

## LIONS BY THE NUMBERS

3

DE **Ezekiel Ansah** registered 3.0 sacks at Cincinnati to highlight his defensive effort that also included 7 tackles (5 solo), 4 tackles for loss and 2 QB hits. Ansah has now registered 3+ sacks in three different games and joined DE Robert Porcher (4) as the only Lions to achieve 3+ sacks in at least three career games since 1982.

3

DB **Quandre Diggs** intercepted a pass against the Bengals, marking his third consecutive game with a pick, which all occurred since being inserted in the starting lineup at strong safety. Diggs is the first Lions player with interceptions in three consecutive games since S Glover Quin when he intercepted passes in four-straight games from Week 13-16 during the 2014 season.

QB **Matthew Stafford** threw for 203 yards at Cincinnati and surpassed 4,000 yards on the season (4,123). Stafford became the second player in NFL history to record 4,000 passing yards in seven consecutive seasons, joining only Saints QB Drew Brees (12).

With three pass defenses at Cincinnati (12/24) CB **Darius Slay** now has 23 pass defenses in 15 games this season. He moved into a tie for second place with CB Robert Bailey (23 in 1999) for single-season pass defenses by a Lions player since 1991.

Through Week 16, Detroit ranks fourth in total takeaways with 28, including 11 opponent fumble recoveries and 17 interceptions.

TE **Eric Ebron** led the team with 5 receptions for 83 yards and scored on a 33-yard touchdown at Cincinnati. Ebron put the Lions on the scoreboard with a career long touchdown reception of 33 yards in the first quarter. His previous best was a 29-yard touchdown catch earlier this year vs. Cleveland (11/12/17).

41

With 3.0 sacks at Cincinnati, DE **Ezekiel Ansah** reached 41 career sacks and became the fifth Lions player to record 40+ career sacks since the statistic became official in 1982. He now ranks fifth on the Lions career sacks list with 41.0.

71

Entering the final game of 2017, CB **Darius Slay** now has 71 career pass defenses in his fifth NFL season. He passed CB Bryant Westbrook (69) for the most career pass defenses by a Lions player since 1991 and is the first Lions player since 1991 to record 70+ career pass defenses over the past 26 seasons.

LB **Tahir Whitehead** finished the game at Cincinnati with 9 total tackles on his way to surpassing 100 tackles for the second consecutive season. Whitehead (104) became the eighth Lions defender since 1991 to record 100+ tackles in multiple seasons.

K **Matt Prater** scored 5 points at Cincinnati (1 FG, 2 PAT), and has now totaled 121 points in 2017. Prater joins K Jason Hanson (1993, 1996, 2007, 2011, 2012) as the only players to score 120+ points in a season twice during their career with the Lions (Prater accumulated 124 points in 2016).

By playing in Week 17 vs. Green Bay, QB **Matthew Stafford** will play in his 125th career game. Currently at 124 games, Stafford already ranks in the Top 10 in multiple categories among players in their first 125 games, including completions (2,985, 1st), passing yards (34,426, 1st) and passing touchdowns (213, 6th)

With 50 receiving yards at Cincinnati, WR **Marvin Jones Jr.** recorded his first 1,000-yard season of his career. Through 15 games, Jones has amassed 1,020 yards, becoming the 15th player in team history to reach 1,000 receiving yards in a season.

Since joining the Lions in 2014, WR **Golden Tate** leads the NFL in yards after the catch (YAC) with 2,371. This season, Tate's 529 YAC rank sixth in the NFL, and among the top six players in that category, Tate is the only wide receiver.



## WALTER PAYTON MAN OF THE YEAR



Twelve-year NFL veteran **Haloti Ngata** was recently selected as the Lions' nominee for the NFL's 2017 Walter Payton Man of the Year Award. Ngata was also named one of eight finalists for the Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award.

### OFA NGATA COLLEGE PREP PROGRAM

Haloti Ngata's parents unexpectedly passed away before they could see him play a game in the NFL. They taught Haloti that being a giant in stature is nice, but being a giant in character is essential, something he conveys through work with his foundation, the Haloti Ngata Family Foundation (HNFF). To honor his mother's memory, Haloti and his wife, Christina, established a college preparation program in her name. In two years, the Ofa Ngata College Preparation Program has assisted over 600 students in six schools in two states. The program provides free college entrance exam preparation courses for students. By the end of the 2017-18 school year, the program will add three new schools and reach over 1,000 students in only three years.

To help raise funds for the Ofa Ngata Program and to raise awareness about the importance of education, the Ngatas host an annual luau. Guests enjoy delicious food, hear from celebrity speakers, watch Polynesian dancing and gain insights about how they can support aspiring college students.



The HNFF has also made significant donations to The Lone Survivor Foundation (\$10,000), The Johns Hopkins Diabetes Research Center (\$50,000), The Maryland School for the Blind (\$10,000), Camp C.O.P.S., a leadership and education camp held in Maryland (\$10,000), provided thousands of dollars for school supplies to individual teachers and supported other organizations and causes at the annual luaus.

### VIDEO BOARDS

In each end zone, the Daktronics main video displays are more than twice the size of the current displays and measure 39.5 feet high by 152 feet wide. Flanking the main displays will be four additional displays measuring 13 feet high by 59 feet wide that can be used individually or coordinated with the main displays for one continuous 270-foot presentation to show live video, instant replays, statistics, graphics and animations, and sponsorship messages.

### THE SNAPPING STANDARD

Muhlbach has served as one of the most critical pieces to the Lions field goal unit since he began long snapping for the Lions during the 2004 season (Week 10 at Jacksonville 11/14/04). He has snapped on 53 successful attempts from 50+ yards, which is the highest total by a long snapper since 2000. Over the past 18 seasons, he is the first and only long snapper to reach 50+ snaps on field goals made from 50-yards and beyond.

➤ In 2017, Muhlbach has snapped on SEVEN 50+ yard field goals, and now has 5+ snaps on 50-yarders in each of the past three seasons (5 in 2015, 7 in 2016). During his career, he has snapped on at least five 50+yard field goals in six different seasons (8 in 2008, 5 in 2010, 5 in 2011, 5 in 2015, 7 in 2016, 7 in 2017).

### FROM 55, AND BEYOND

- By making two field goals from 55+ yards against Atlanta, Prater became the second player in NFL history to connect on at least 10 career 55+yard field goals. He joined Raiders K Sebastian Janikowski (13) as the only kickers to achieve this during their careers. Prater now has 11 career 55+yard field goals, which includes four in 2017 and six since joining the Lions in 2014.
- Dating back to Prater's NFL record-setting 64-yard field goal vs. Tennessee December 8, 2013 while with Denver, he concluded his streak at seven straight field goals from 55+ yards. **According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his streak of seven consecutive 55+yard field goals made is the longest such streak in NFL history.**

### THROUGH THE UPRIGHTS AND INTO THE RECORD BOOKS

Prater connected on a 59-yard field goal to end the first half in the 2015 season finale at Chicago (1/3/16), setting a new team record for the longest field goal in Lions history. Prater's 59-yarder surpassed the previous record of 56 accomplished twice by K Jason Hanson (Cle 10/8/95; at Car 11/16/08).

- Prater's kick was the longest in the history of Soldier Field. Bears K Robbie Gould made the previous long of 58 yards.
- In the 2017 Week 1 win against the Cardinals (9/10) Prater again added to his lore with a 58-yard field goal in the first half. It tied the second-longest field goal in team history that was also set by Prater in 2016 at Minnesota (11/6).

The Lions started the season with a victory over Arizona in the season-opener 35-23. Both teams exchanged turnovers on their opening drives of the season, soon after Lions S Tavon Wilson's interception. Lions QB Matthew Stafford threw an interception on Detroit's first possession caught by Cardinals CB Justin Bethel who would return it 82 yards for a touchdown, putting the Cardinals up 7-0. Cardinals K Phil Dawson would later convert on a 24-yard field goal attempt, making it 10-0. After a few stalled drives from both teams, the Lions would get their first touchdown of the season, which was set up nicely by S Glover Quin's interception. It came with 4:30 left in the first half as Stafford found WR Marvin Jones Jr. for a 6-yard touchdown, capping off an 11 play, 42-yard drive. Just before time expired in the first half, Lions K Matt Prater knocked through a 58-yard field goal putting the score at 10-9 going into halftime. Out of the half, it was Arizona scored first following an impressive 94-yard drive from the Cardinals offense, as RB Kerwynn Williams took a handoff from Palmer up the middle for a 3-yard score, making it 17-9. However, the Lions defense once again would step up for the Lions, as DT A'Shawn Robinson would force a fumble while bringing down Cardinals RB David Johnson. The Lions made good on their opportunity, as Matthew Stafford found RB Theo Riddick in the middle of the field for a 7-yard touchdown to finish off a drive that took the Lions only two plays and 45 seconds to complete, closing the score to 17-15 in favor of the Cardinals. The ensuing Cardinals drive stalled thanks in part to a sack from DE Anthony Zettel, and the Lions once again able to respond as WR Kenny Golladay found the end zone on a 10-yard pass from Stafford for his first-career touchdown, giving the Lions a 21-17 lead with 9:33 left in the fourth quarter. It would not take Stafford long to once again connect with Golladay for a score, after another stalled Cardinals drive, Golladay was hit in stride and leaped into the air to bring down his second touchdown of the day on a 45-yard deep ball, once again extending the Lions lead to 28-17. The Lions defense would continue the already impressive performance. On the first play of the Cardinals ensuing drive, S Miles Killebrew picked off Palmer's pass intended for RB Andre Ellington for a 45-yard interception touchdown return upping the lead to 35-17 in favor of the Lions with 4:13 left to play in the game. It was the Lions third interception and fourth turnover created on the day. The Cardinals however would come down the field and score one last time, as Palmer finished off a 75-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Cardinals J.J. Nelson, narrowing the Lions lead to 35-23. After a failed onside kick attempt, Stafford closed the win by taking a knee.

The Detroit Lions improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2011 after defeating the New York Giants 24-10 at MetLife Stadium on Monday Night Football. The first score of the game came after both offenses exchanged stalled drives, as QB Matthew Stafford was able to lead his offense down the field 54 yards to set up a 27-yard touchdown strike to WR Marvin Jones Jr. On the very next drive, Giants QB Eli Manning drove down the field for a score, leading his offense to an 8-play, 75-yard drive capped off by an 18-yard touchdown pass to rookie TE Evan Engram to tie things up at 7-7 at the start off the second quarter. The teams then exchanged turnovers on back-to-back plays. A Stafford fumble gave the Giants possession of the ball, but Lions LB Tahir Whitehead was able to pick off a Manning pass intended for Engram on the ensuing possession. The Lions were then able to take advantage of the short field in front of them, as Stafford found the end zone for the second time of the night, this time connecting with TE Eric Ebron on a 7-yard touch pass to put the Lions up 14-7 with 8:43 left in the second quarter. With :30 seconds left in the first half, K Matt Prater was able to knock a 56-yard field goal off the bottom post, giving the Lions the 17-7 lead into halftime. The Giants struck first in the second half, as K Aldrick Rosas connected on a 25-yard attempt, capping off a 10 play, 68-yard drive and cutting the Lions' lead down to 17-10 with 4:58 left in the third quarter. The final scoring play of the game was generated off of special teams, as Lions rookie CB Jamal Agnew returned a Brad Wing punt 88-yards for a Lions touchdown, increasing the lead to 24-10 with 12:56 remaining in the fourth quarter. Agnew became the first player in Lions history to return a punt for a touchdown on Monday Night Football.

The Detroit Lions dropped to 2-1 on the year after their 30-26 loss to the Falcons. Atlanta scored first, driving 75 yards on the opening drive for a WR Mohamed Sanu four-yard touchdown. The ensuing Lions drive stalled as the Falcons were able to add to their lead with a 36-yard field goal to make it 10-0 with 12:51 left in the second quarter. The Detroit Lions improved to 3-1 as they defeated the Minnesota Vikings 14-7 at U.S. Bank Stadium. After both teams were held scoreless in the first quarter, the Lions were able to get on the board in the second quarter. A 38-yard pass from QB Matthew Stafford to WR Marvin Jones Jr. on third down set up a 29-yard field goal attempt for K Matt Prater, capping off the 15-play, 82-yard drive and giving the Lions a 3-0 lead. The Lions fell to 8-7 on the season after a 26-17 defeat at the Cincinnati Bengals. With 5:00 left in the first quarter, Lions QB Matthew Stafford was able to find TE Eric Ebron deep down the right side of the field for a 33-yard touchdown pass, putting the Lions up 7-0. The connection through the air capped off a four-play, 52 yard drive for Detroit's offense. In the second quarter, Bengals K Randy Bullock would finish off a Bengals drive with a successful 29-yard field goal, making the score 7-3 with 7:35 left to play in the first half. With just :04 seconds left in the second quarter, Bullock would successfully convert on his second field goal attempt of the game, this time from 27-yards, setting the score at 7-6 in favor of Detroit at the half. On the opening drive of the second half, Lions K Matt Prater connected on a 23-yard field goal attempt, increasing the lead to 10-6. On the ensuing Bengals drive, QB Andy Dalton found TE C.J. Uzomah for a short one-yard touchdown pass, giving Cincinnati their first lead of the game at 13-10. After a missed Lions field goal attempt, Cincinnati would drive 43 yards on 11-plays, setting up a 35-yard field goal for Bullock, increasing the Bengals lead to 16-10. With 9:54 left to play, Lions RB Tion Green found the scored on a 5-yard touchdown run, allowing the Lions to regain the lead 17-16. On the following Bengals drive, Bullock converted on a 51-yard field goal attempt, his fourth of the day, capping off an 11-play, 53 yard drive for Cincinnati and giving them the 19-17 lead with 4:42 left to play in the contest. After the ensuing Lions drive stalled, Bengals RB Giovani Bernard got into the endzone after a 12-yard rush to the right side, extending the Bengals lead to 26-17 late in the fourth quarter to help seal Cincinnati's victory.
