# CALDWELL'S FOURTH SEASON IN DETROIT



#### JIM CALDWELL **Head Coach** Years with Lions: 4 Years as NFL Head Coach: 7 Years in NFL: 17

#### REACHING 30 WINS

With two playoff appearances in his first three years, Jim Caldwell has established himself as one of the most successful head coaches in recent franchise history. In his 52nd game as the Lions Head Coach (Week 4 at Min; 10/1/17), Caldwell led the team to a 14-7 win at Minnesota and recorded his 30th overall win since joining the Lions in 2014. By reaching 30 career wins > One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season with the club in 52 games, he became the fastest Lions head coach to reach 30 career wins since Head Coach Buddy Parker, who recorded 30 wins in 41 games (1951-54). His overall record > From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and with the Lions stands at 35-28 (.555).

Beginning his football coaching career in 1977 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, the University of Iowa, 2017 marks Caldwell's 40th consecutive season coaching football.

#### 100 CLUB

With a 14-7 win over Minnesota in Week 4 of the 2017 season. Caldwell logged his 56th overall win in his 100th career regular season game. His career record as a head coach (35-28 in DET; 26-22 in IND) now stands at 61-50 (.549) in 111 career games.

### LIONS FINISH 9-7 IN 2016, EARN PLAYOFF BERTH

The Lions finished the 2016 season with a record of 9-7 and earned the team's second playoff berth in the past three REGULAR SEASON seasons. The last time the Lions made the playoffs twice in a Year Team G three-year span was 1997 and 1999.

> By earning a playoff berth in 2016, Caldwell joins Buddy Parker (1952, 1953) and Bobby Ross (1997, 1999) as the only coaches in Lions history to lead the team to the playoffs twice in their first three seasons with the club.

### EIGHT COMEBACK WINS IN 2016

The Lions finished the 2016 season with a record of 9-7. In eight of the team's nine wins, the Lions trailed in the fourth quarter and went on to win the game. Detroit set a new NFL record, surpassing the previous total of seven set by the 2009 Indianapolis Colts (also coached by Jim Caldwell), for the most wins in a season after trailing in the fourth quarter.

### **COACHING OVERVIEW**

> Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.

In 16 previous NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 13 winning seasons and only twice finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 173-98 regular season record, along with 14 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three conference championships and two Super Bowl wins.

➤ As an NFL head coach (six seasons), Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009, 11 with Detroit in 2014). Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Ind and Bal).

➤ In his first year as head coach for IND (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.

wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.

was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).

> After being appointed Ravens offensive coordinator in December 2012, Baltimore went on to win five of its next seven games, including Super Bowl XLVII. During that span, the offense averaged 400.6 yards per game, including an average of 410.3 yards per game during the four playoff wins.

# **QUINN MAKES HIS MARK**



BOB QUINN
Executive Vice President and
General Manager
Years with Lions: 2
Years in NFL: 18

➤ While working for the New England Patriots, he helped contribute to one of the most impressive stretches in NFL history, one that produced four Super Bowl titles, including the most recent championship in 2014 (Super Bowl XLIX). Since 2000, Quinn's first year with New England, the Patriots have won six AFC Championships, 13 AFC East titles, 12+ games in a season 10 times (which includes the past six years) and 10+ games in 14 of his 16 seasons.

### FIRST SEASON AT THE HELM

Quinn's first season in the role of a franchise's top football executive culminated in a playoff appearance, and he became the only first-year executive among nine in the NFL to accomplish this feat since the 2013 season. In doing so, Quinn also became the Lions' first general manager to guide the team to the playoffs in his inaugural season since Nick Kerbawy in 1952.

Along with the nearly 40-percent changeover and upgrade to the team's roster that he inherited, Quinn's changes paid dividends in 2016 when the Lions finished 9-7 on the team's

way to the playoffs.

➤ Entering his second season, Quinn's ongoing commitment to improve all aspects of the club's football operations has included restructuring the player personnel department and scouting evaluation processes; renovating the team's weight room and practice fields along with other facility improvements; upgrading the team's football information and video technology; and instituting a comprehensive nutritional program, which included the hiring of a performance dietician for the players.

# **DRAFTING EXPERTISE**

Quinn's initial draft class in 2016 featured the selection of six linemen on offense and defense, the most linemen in a Lions draft since 1989 and the most ever in a seven-round draft. Highlighting last year's draft class was the Lions' first-round selection T Taylor Decker, who earned all-rookie honors in 2016. Additionally, DT A'Shawn Robinson and C/G Graham Glasgow would earn starting roles during their rookie seasons. > Of the 12 playoff teams in 2016, no team had members of its draft class play more games (108) than the Detroit Lions.

# PATRIOTS PAST

During his time with New England, Quinn served a number of roles in the player personnel department, including most recently as Director of Pro Scouting from 2012-15. While he worked as Director of Pro Scouting, the Patriots won the 2014 Super Bowl and four-straight AFC East Division championships.

From 2009-2012, Quinn was the Assistant Director of Pro Personnel. For the previous nine years, Quinn worked in several different capacities within the Patriots player personnel department, including roles in college scouting as a National Scout and Regional Scout. He played an integral role in evaluating and procuring talent for the team through the NFL draft process, free agency, trades, etc.

# WHAT THEY SAID

The following are post-game quote sheets from the Detroit Lions' Week 16 game at Cincinnati.

#### HEAD COACH JIM CALDWELL

On the loss at Cincinnati: "We were struggling today. That's the fact of the matter. They did a better job controlling the line of scrimmage on us. They ran the ball well. They had a couple sparks here and there, but we just were not sharp. We had a few plays here and there, but they played better."

On why he thinks they were not sharper with so much on the line: "Every game's on the line. Last two weeks they've been on the line. Obviously, in terms of how we've played. we've played decently I think a couple weeks in a row, just didn't play well today."

On why he did not trust his offense on many fourth and short situations: "I mean, earlier in the game you're talking about, I think we were up in one situation. There was another SAFETY GLOVER QUIN that was fourth and two or something close, but we got down to it, and we knew we obviously had to go after it, and we went after it. And our guys came through, and took it down the field and scored, but you just make a decision on that. You don't get into that situation, and obviously it turns into a different game where it doesn't have to be at that particular point in time. So, you have to wait and measure those things out."

On how being down three starters on the offensive line affected the offense: "Yeah, really shouldn't affect it at all, you know. I don't care who we have in there. Doesn't really matter, you've never heard me make an excuse in any situation and I'm not going to start today. We just got to play better, we got to get better. That's why we have 53 men on the roster, that's why you have 10 practice squad guys. Those guys have to be able to step up and play for you. We didn't play as well as we'd like to."

### OUARTERBACK MATTHEW STAFFORD

On if the game felt like a struggle from start to finish: "Yeah. We didn't play well. We weren't moving the chains enough, weren't making enough big plays. If you don't do those things on the road, it's tough to win."

On why the offense struggled so much with so much on the line: "It's an NFL football game, and sometimes it's not going to be easy. You have to go out there and battle. For some reason or another, we didn't score enough points, and that will cost vou."

On how the offensive line played despite missing three starters: "Those guys battled and played well. We have to make plays on the outside; that is how you score points in this league."

On missing the playoffs and not being able to get over the hump: "We have been to the playoffs before, so I don't know about not getting over the hump. It's not fun when you get eliminated. It's not fun. We put a lot of work into it. My teammates and coaches and everybody put a lot of work into it, so when it doesn't happen – it's disappointing,"

On Bengals RB Gio Bernard's big game and not being able to slow him down: "He had a couple of breakout runs and screens. We just didn't do a good enough job executing. We didn't tackle well and we didn't make enough plays."

On what went wrong on defense: "It's very frustrating. We didn't make enough plays to win the game. We didn't stop the run and they controlled the line of scrimmage. When you aren't able to do those things, you lose ball games."

# WIDE RECEIVER MARVIN JONES JR.

On where the team fell short against Cincinnati: "We didn't execute. There were a few times where we had some success but when it matters most you have to cash in and we didn't do that and they did."

On what it would have meant for the team to get a win: "It would mean a lot. Had we won we're still in. We lost, so we're out and that's tough. We need to come with it for the next game and play lights out. We laid an egg out there today and we have to come back."



# WHAT THEY SAID

On what it means to him to hit 1,000 receiving yards this Active Roster Only season: "It really doesn't mean anything right now. After the season I'll look back at my accomplishments. I needed 30 yards - I would've hit it anyway."

On how to keep focus heading into next week: "We're all Jarrad Davis professionals and we're passionate for the game. We'll all go out there and play like we need to play. We have a game left Eric Ebron and this is what we do. We have to go out on a good note. We all have to go and practice with energy and have to be full of energy come Sunday."

#### LINEBACKER TAHIR WHITEHEAD

On what went wrong against the Bengals: "We didn't capitalize. We didn't play the greatest ball today."

On not being able to get stops late in the game: "We got Paul Worrilow a few penalties late in the game and those made a huge difference. They just kind of bled us out. They were running well in the end. That's credit to them, but I believe we could've played better ball."

On the mood in the locker room after the game: "We know we could've played better but we didn't do enough to get it done."

On knowing the team is eliminated from playoff **contention:** "There's a lot of mental pride in this locker room. The season isn't over. We still have one more game and we have to go out there and make it happen."

DE **Ezekiel Ansah** registered 3.0 sacks at Cincinnati to highlight his defensive effort that also included 7 tackles (5 solo), 4 tackles for loss and 2 QB hits. Ansah has now registered 3+ sacks in three different games and joined DE Robert Porcher (4) as the only Lions to achieve 3+ sacks in at least three career games since 1982.

DB Quandre Diggs intercepted a pass against the Bengals, marking his third consecutive game with a pick, which all occurred since being inserted in the starting lineup at strong safety. Diggs is the first Lions player with interceptions in three consecutive games since S Glover Quin when he intercepted passes in four-straight games from Week 13-16 during the 2014 season.

Entering the final game of 2017, CB **Darius Slay** now has 71 career pass defenses in his fifth NFL season. He passed CB Bryant Westbrook (69) for the most career pass defenses by a Lions player since 1991 and is the first Lions player since 1991 to record 70+ career pass defenses over the past 26 seasons.

LB **Tahir Whitehead** finished the game at Cincinnati with 9 total tackles on his way to surpassing 100 tackles for the second consecutive season. Whitehead (104) became the eighth Lions defender since 1991 to record 100+ tackles in multiple seasons.


# **WALTER PAYTON MAN OF THE YEAR**

By the end of the 2017-18 school year, the program will add three new schools and reach over 1,000 students in only three years.

#### *VIDEO BOARDS*

In each end zone, the Daktronics main video displays are more than twice the size of the current displays and measure 39.5 feet high by 152 feet wide. Flanking the main displays will be four additional displays measuring 13 feet high by 59 feet wide that can be used individually or coordinated with the main displays for one continuous 270-foot presentation to show live video, instant replays, statistics, graphics and animations, and sponsorship messages.



#### **GRIDIRON CLUB**





Muhlbach has served as one of the most critical pieces to the Lions field goal unit since he began long snapping for the Lions during the 2004 season (Week 10 at Jacksonville 11/14/04). He has snapped on 53 successful attempts from 50+ yards, which is the highest total by a long snapper since 2000. Over the past  $\frac{5}{*}$ 18 seasons, he is the first and only long snapper to reach 50+ snaps on field goals made from 50-yards and beyond.

Currently in his ninth season, S Don Carey has cemented himself as the Lions' leading tackler on special teams coverage. The team also signed special teams ace LB Nick Bellore this season following a stint with the San Francisco 49ers.

> With one special teams tackle against the Bengals, Carey now has 71 total special teams tackles for his career. Since joining the Lions in 2011, Carey has 67 total special teams tackles in 83 games with the team.

Since 2012, the Carey (6th) and Bellore (5th) both rank in the Top 10 in total special teams tackles during that span.

In the third quarter at New Orleans, Rookie CB **Jamal Agnew** returned a Saints punt 74 yards for a touchdown, his second of the season. He joined Hall of Fame CB Jack Christiansen (4 in 1951) as the only rookies in Lions history to return 2+ punts for TDs.

- ➤ He also became the fifth Lions player ever to record 2+ punt return touchdowns in a season, joining Christiansen (4 in 1951, 2 in 1952), Tom Watkins (2 in 1964), WR Eddie Drummond (2 in 2004) and WR Andre Roberts (2 in 2016).
- Through Week 16, Agnew's two punt return TDs rank first in the NFL, as well as his 16.0 punt return average (26 PR, 416 yards).

Agnew stretched the Lions' lead against the New York Giants in Week 2 when he returned a punt 88 yards for a score with 12:56 left in the fourth quarter. The punt return gave the Lions a 24-10 advantage that would end up as the final score. In the game, he returned 3 punts for 101 yards (33.7 avg).

Agnew's 88-yard punt return touchdown was the fifthlongest punt return in Lions history and the longest since WR Reggie Swinton returned a punt 89 yards for a touchdown at Carolina December 21, 2003.



The Lions started the season with a victory over Arizona in the season-opener 35-23. Both teams exchanged turnovers on their opening drives of the season, soon after Lions S Tavon Wilson's interception. Lions QB Matthew Stafford threw an interception on Detroit's first possession caught by Cardinals CB Justin Bethel who would return it 82 yards for a touchdown, putting the Cardinals up 7-0. Cardinals K Phil Dawson would later convert on a 24-yard field goal attempt, making it 10-0. After a few stalled drives from both teams, the Lions would get their first touchdown of the season, which was set up nicely by S Glover Quin's interception. It came with 4:30 left in the first half as Stafford found MR Maryin Jones Jr. for a 6-yard touchdown of the season of the se capping off an 11 play, 42-yard drive. Just before time expired in the first half, Lions K Matt Prater knocked through a 58-yard field goal putting the score at 10-9 going into halftime. It was the Lions third interception and fourth turnover created on the day. The Cardinals however would come down the field and score one last time, as Palmer finished off a 75-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Cardinals J.J. Nelson, narrowing the Lions lead to 35-23. After a failed onside kick attempt, Stafford closed the win by taking a knee.

The Detroit Lions improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2011 after defeating the New York Giants 24-10 at MetLife Stadium on Monday Night Football. The first score of the game came after both offenses exchanged stalled drives, as QB Matthew Stafford was able to lead his offense down the field 54 yards to set up a 27-yard touchdown strike to WR Marvin Jones Jr. On the very next drive, Giants QB Eli Manning drove down the field for a score, leading his offense to an 8-play, 75-yard drive capped off by an 19-yard touchdown pass to rookie TE Evan Engram to tie things up at 7-7 at the start off the second quarter. The teams then exchanged turnovers on back-to-back plays. A Stafford fumble gave the Giants possession of the ball, but Lions LB Tahir Whitehead was able to pick off a Manning pass intended for Engram on the ensuing possession. The Lions were then able to take advantage of the short field in front of them, as Stafford found the end zone for the second time of the night, this time connecting with TE Eric Ebron on a 7-yard touch pass to put the Lions up 14-7 with 8:43 left in the second quarter. With :30 seconds left in the first half, K Matt Prater was able to knock a 56-yard field goal off the bottom post, giving the Lions the 17-7 lead into halftime. The Giants struck first in the second half, as K Aldrick Rosas connected on a 25-yard attempt, capping off a 10 play, 68-yard drive and cutting the Lions' lead down to 17-10 with 4:58 left in the third quarter. The final scoring play of the game was generated off of special teams, as Lions rookie CB Jamal Agnew returned a Brad Wing punt 88yards for a Lions touchdown, increasing the lead to 24-10 with 12:56 remaining in the fourth quarter. Agnew became the first player in Lions history to return a punt for a touchdown on Monday Night Football.

The Lions dropped to 3-4 on the year after a 20-15 loss on Sunday Night Football to the Pittsburgh Steelers. The scoring opened up on the game's first drive when Steelers K Chris Boswell connected on a 34-yard field goal attempt, successfully capping off the seven-play, 59-yard drive. On the ensuing Lions drive, K Matt Prater made good on his first attempt, a 44-yarder, tying the game at 3-3 with 7:50 left in the first quarter. The next scoring play came with 9:11 left in the second quarter, when Prater connected on his second attempt of the game, a 37-yarder, which gave the Lions their first lead of the game at 6-3. Prater was once again called on in the half, this time to make his fourth field goal of game right before halftime from 34-yards out. The successful conversion capped off an eight-play, 63-yard drive, as the Lions took the 12-10 lead into halftime. On the Steelers' opening drive of the second half, Boswell successfully converted on his second field goal attempt of the night, a 38-yarder, giving the Steelers the slight edge at 13-12 with 9:21 left in the third quarter. With 3:01 left in the third quarter, Roethlisberger found WR JuJu Smith-Schuster for a 97-yard touchdown, upping the Steelers lead to 20-12. On the ensuing Lions drive, Prater would make his fifth field goal attempt of the game, a 19-yard attempt, pulling the Steelers back to a five-point lead at 20-15, a lead they would hold on to until the end of regulation.

With 6:68 left in the first half, the Ravens broadened their lead to 17-0 as Flacco hit FB Patrick Ricard for a three-yard touchdown pass. The scoring play concluded the six-play, 36-yard drive for the Ravens. Just before the end of the first half, Tucker would convert on his second field goal attempt of the day, a 46-yard try, setting the score at 20-0 as time expired in the second quarter. On the Lions first drive of the second half, RB Theo Riddick ran 4-yards to the right side for a touchdown. The score was the Lions first of the day, and put the Ravens lead at 20-7. With 2:23 left in the third quarter, Lions RB Tion Green scored his first-career touchdown on a six-yard run, making the score 20-13 still in favor of Baltimore. On the very next Ravens drive, RB Alex Collins would find the end zone after a seven-yard touchdown rush, and gave the Ravens a two-score lead at 27-13. On the ensuing Lions drive and with 10:24 left to play, Lions LB Nick Bellore lined up at fullback near the goal line. Bellore hauled in his first-career touchdown with a one-yard touchdown pass from Stafford, shrinking the Ravens lead at 27-20. With 6:59 to play in the game, Tucker successfully kicked a 51-yard field goal that increased the Ravens lead to 30-20. After a Lions interception on the following drive, the Ravens were able to extend the lead. Once again Collins would find the end zone for the second time in the game after a six-yard run, making it 37-20 in favor of the Ravens with 4:00 to play. After Stafford exited the game due to injury, Lions QB Jake Rudock would have his pass intercepted and returned 45-yards for a Ravens touchdown by S Eri

The Lions improved to 7-6 on the season after a 24-21 road victory over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. After both teams punted on their respective opening drives, Lions RB Theo Riddick would cap off a seven play, 74-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown rush, putting Detroit up 7-0 early. On the ensuing Buccaneers possession, RB Doug Martin rushed it in from one yard out for a touchdown, tying the game at 7-7 with 2:51 left in the first quarter. With 7:41 left in the second quarter, Lions QB Matthew Stafford found WR Golden Tate for a five-yard touchdown pass making it 14-7 in favor of Detroit. In the third quarter, Riddick found the end zone for a second time with an 18-yard touchdown run, extending the Lions lead to 21-7. With 13:47 left in the fourth quarter, the Buccaneers would reduce the Lions lead to one touchdown as QB Jameis Winton connected with TE 0.J. Howard for a short two-yard touchdown pass, setting the score at 21-14. The passing touchdown capped off a 10-play, 75 yard drive for the Buccaneers that took 4:30 to complete. After the ensuing Lions drive stalled T Leonard Wester lined up as an eligible receiver along the goal line for the Buccaneers. Winston dumped it off to Wester for a Buccaneers two-yard touchdown pass, effectively tying the game at 21-21. After Stafford moved the offense into Buccaneers territory, K Matt Prater came out to attempt a 46-yard field with just :25 seconds left in the game. Prater successfully connected from 46-yards out for the 14th game-winning field goal of his career with less than 2:00 to play in the fourth quarter or overtime, sealing the Lions' 24-21 win over Tampa Bay.
