TITANS NOTES

- QB MARCUS MARIOTA passed for 2 TDs, incl. deflected pass which he caught for TD, last week. Is 1 of 5 QBs in NFL history with 9,000+ pass yards (9,476) & 900+ rush yards (913) in 1st 3 seasons. Since entering league in 2015, has 40 TD passes vs. 0 INTs in red zone, highest TD/INT ratio in NFL over span (incl. playoffs).
- **RB DERRICK HENRY** rushed for 156 yards with TD last week & joined **EDDIE GEORGE** (1/16/00) as only players in team history with 150+ rush yards in postseason game. Led team with career-high 744 rush yards. Had 3 65+ yard TDs from scrimmage in 2017, most in NFL. **RB DE MARCO MURRAY** has 225 scrimmage yards (112.5 per game) & 2 rush TDs in 2 career postseason games. Leads NFL with 43 rush TDs & ranks 2nd in league with 5,614 rush yards since 2013.
- **TE DELANIE WALKER** led team with 74 catches & 807 rec. yards. Is 1 of 2 NFL TEs (**TRAVIS KELCE**) with 800+ rec. yards in each of past 4 seasons. Has 3 TD catches in his past 2 vs. NE. **WR ERIC DECKER** had TD catch last week. Had rec. TD in his last game vs. NE (12/27/15 with NYJ).
- LB WESLEY WOODYARD led team with career-high 121 tackles. Was 1 of 2 players in NFL (DEMARIO DAVIS) with 100+ tackles & 5+ sacks (5). S KEVIN BYARD tied for NFL lead with 8 INTs, 3rd most by safety in team history. Had league-leading 3 multi-INT games in 2017. DT JURRELL CASEY had 6 sacks, his 5th consecutive season with 5+ sacks. Led team with 12 TFL. Had sack in last game vs. NE. LB BRIAN ORAKPO had 1.5 sacks last week.

PATRIOTS NOTES

- **QB TOM BRADY** is all-time postseason leader in career att. (1,325), comp. (831), pass yards (9,094) & pass TDs (63). Has 12 career 300+ pass yard games in playoffs, most in NFL history. Is 25-9 (.735) as starter in postseason, most wins by QB in league annals. Led NFL with 4,577 pass yards & ranked 1st in AFC with 32 TD passes, both most by QB at age 40 or older. In past 6 vs. Ten. (incl. postseason), has 1,528 pass yards (254 per game) with 13 TDs vs. 0 INTs for 111.1 rating.
- **RB DION LEWIS** led team with career-high 896 rush yards. Has 366 scrimmage yards (122 per game) with 5 TDs (3 rush, 2 rec.) in past 3. In last playoff game (SB LI), **RB JAMES WHITE** set single-game SB record with 14 catches & scored 3 TDs (2 rush, 1 rec.), tied for most in single game in SB history. Since 2015, has 12 TD catches, most among NFL RBs.
- TE ROB GRONKOWSKI led all NFL TEs with 1,084 rec. yards, his 4th career 1,000+ yard season, tied with TONY GONZALEZ and JASON WITTEN for most among TEs in NFL history. In past 5 postseason games, has 431 rec. yards (86.2 per game) & 6 TDs. WR CHRIS HOGAN had 332 rec. yards (110.7 per game) & 2 TDs in 2016 playoffs.
- S DEVIN MC COURTY led team with career-high 94 tackles. DE TREY FLOWERS had 2.5 sacks in SB LI.
 CB MALCOLM BUTLER has 7 PD & INT in past 6 in postseason. LB JAMES HARRISON has 11 career sacks in postseason, tied for 5th most in NFL history.
- **K STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI** has made 22 consecutive FGs in postseason, 2nd longest streak in NFL history.
