STEELERS CLAIM THE NORTH



With a 39-38 win in Week 14 vs. the Baltimore Ravens, the Pittsburgh Steelers clinched the 2017 AFC North division crown.

Pittsburgh secured the AFC North division title for the eighth time since NFL realignment in 2002 - the most among division teams (Pittsburgh: 8, Baltimore: 4 and Cincinnati: 4).

The Steelers are one of the most succesful teams in NFL history. The team's 23 division titles, 30 playoff berths and 36 postseason wins are the most since the AFL-NFL merger in 1970:

STEELERS SUPER BOWL HISTORY

The Steelers are 36-25 (.590) in the postseason, including a 21-11 record at home, a 9-12 mark on the road and a 6-2 record at neutral sites (Super Bowls IX, X, XIII, XIV, XXX, XL, XLIII and XLV).

Pittsburgh has played in the Super Bowl three times since 2005 and the team's eight trips to the Super Bowl are tied for the second most in NFL history with the Dallas Cowboys and Denver Broncos (New England: 9). The Steelers' six wins in the Super Bowl are the most in league history.

MISC. STEELERS POSTSEASON NOTES

- In 2005, the Steelers became the first No. 6 seed in NFL history to win the Super Bowl. Since then two other Wild Card teams have gone on to win the Super Bowl ('10 Green Bay, sixth seed and '07 Giants, fifth seed).
- Pittsburgh has played in 60 playoff games, which is second all-time behind Dallas (61).
- The Steelers have won 12 of their last 18 postseason games.
- Pittsburgh is 8-4 all-time in the postseason at Heinz Field since the stadium opened in 2001, including winning five of their previous six.
- The Steelers won the AFC Central title a team-record six consecutive seasons from 1974-79. They also won four consecutive division titles from 1994-97.
- The Steelers won a team-record seven consecutive postseason games, including two Super Bowls (IX and X), from Dec. 22, 1974 through Dec. 19, 1976. They won six consecutive postseason games from Dec. 30, 1978 through Jan. 20, 1980, including victories in Super Bowls XIII and XIV.
- The Steelers have been shut out only once in the postseason, during the 1947 Eastern Division Playoff game, Dec. 21, 1947, versus the Philadelphia Eagles. The Steelers and Eagles finished that season with 8-4 records and tied for first place in the Eastern Division. In those days, there was only one NFL Championship Game, so the two Pennsylvania neighbors squared off for the right to face the Chicago Cardinals in the Championship Game. The Eagles won, 21-0, but lost in the Championship Game, 28-21, to the Cardinals, the same franchise the Steelers faced in Super Bowl XLIII.
- The Steelers record for fewest points allowed in a playoff game is five, during a 34-5 win in the 1978 AFC Championship Game versus the Houston Oilers at Three Rivers Stadium, on Jan. 7, 1979. - Became the second head coach in NFL history to reach two Super Bowls in his first four seasons as a head coach.

K Chris Boswell gave Pittsburgh an early 3-0 lead, but Jacksonville RB Leonard Fournette found the end zone on a 2-yard run in the second quarter, shifting the scoreboard to 7-3. The Steelers recaptured the lead with two more Boswell field goals.

Trailing 9-7, Jacksonville LB Travis Smith picked off **QB Ben Rothlisberger** and returned it 28-yards for a touchdown. The extra point failed. On the ensuing drive, Jaguars S Barry Church stepped in front of a Roethlisberger pass intended for **WR Antonio Brown** and returned it to the end zone, registering the Jaguars' second pick-6 and giving Jacksonville a 20-9 lead over Pittsburgh.

A Jacksonville field goal followed by a second touchdown from Fournette seeled the Jaguars victory.

Roethlisberger completed 33-of-55 passes for 312 yards and five interceptions, marking the 50th 300-yard passing performance of his regular-season career. Brown caught 10 passes for 157 yards, marking his third game of the season with at least 10 catches and 100 receiving yards.

His 116 wins in his first 11 seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach in his first 11 campaigns and his two Super Bowl appearances are second-most for the franchise for a coach in his first 11 seasons.

Tomlin's eight postseason berths are tied as the most in a coach's first 11 seasons with the Steelers and his six division titles are third-most.

TOMLIN'S 100TH IN 10

Mike Tomlin became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 100-win club to make the Steelers the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.

Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in Week 14 of 2016 at Buffalo in his 157th career regular-season games to mark the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark in the win column (Chuck Noll: 158 and Bill Cowher: 163).

Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2001: 99 and Chuck Noll: 1976-78: 88).

Tomlin also joined an elite head coach fraternity in NFL history by reaching 100 wins in his 10th season:

 He is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons with one franchise, joining Bill Belichick (New England), Mike Ditka (Chicago), Joe Gibbs (Washington), John Madden (Oakland), Mike McCarthy (Green Bay), Marty Schottenheimer (Kansas City), Mike Shanahan (Denver) and Don Shula (Miami).

QB Ben Roethlisberger quarterbacked the Steelers to a 12-3 record, including a 5-0 mark vs. AFC North foes, in his 15 games played and started during the 2017 regular season.

Roethlisberger became the first quarterback in NFL history to record three 500-passing yard games in a career with a 506yard performance in Week 14's AFC North Division clinching win against Baltimore at Heinz Field (39-38). He set single-game team records for pass completions (44) and pass attempts (66).

Roethlisberger earned his 125th regular-season victory as a starter in the 26-9 win against Minnesota in Week Two. He completed 23-of-35 passing for 243 yards with two touchdowns for a passer rating of 104.8 in the win.

In Week Five, Roethlisberger's 312 passing yards marked the 50th 300-yard game of his regular-season career to become the 11th quarterback in NFL history to throw for at least 300 yards in 50 regular-season games and the ninth to do so with one team.

Roethlisberger made his 150th career regular season start in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis in 2014 to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to record 100 wins in their first 150 regular season starts (Tom Brady: 116, Joe Montana: 108, Terry and Bradshaw: 102).

Roethlisberger registered his 90th career win in his 135th career start, becoming the fifth fastest quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 90 wins.

He earned his 130th win as a starting quarterback in his 192nd start in Week 10 of 2017 at Indianapolis to mark the third-fewest starts in NFL history to win 130 games (Tom Brady: 168 and Peyton Manning: 189).

CONTROLLING THE NORTH

FACING THE NFC

In 51 career regular-season games against NFC opponents, QB Ben Roethlisberger has posted a 35-16 record, including winning each of his first seven starts against conference members.

Roethlisberger completed 23-of-35 passing for 243 yards with two touchdowns for a passer rating of 104.8 in Week Two's 26-9 win at Heinz Field against the Minnesota Vikings, and tallied his first 300-yard game of 2017, leading the Steelers to a 20-15 win at Detroit in Week Eight, finishing with 317 yards, including a 97yard touchdown connection with WR JuJu Smith-Schuster. He completed 33-of-45 passes for 351 yards with four touchdowns and two interceptions for a passer rating of 106.8, leading the Steelers to a game-winning drive for the 41st time in his NFL career (regular season: 37 / postseason: 4) in a 31-28 win vs. Green Bay on Sunday Night Football in Week 12.

THE 45 AND 50,000 CLUB

QB Ben Roethlisberger became the eighth quarterback in NFL history - first in team history - to reach 50,000 passing yards in regular-season career games - a feat he accomplished in Week 13 of 2017 at Cincinnati. He reached 50,000 passing yards in his 197th regular-season game to become the fifth quarterback in NFL history to reach the milestone in fewer than 200 games.

Roethlisberger became the first player in Steelers history to register 45,000 career passing yards in Week 10's game vs. Dallas. He was the 11th quarterback in NFL history to reach the mark, the eighth to do so with one team, and the fourth active signal caller with 45,000 passing yards.

BEN GOING OVER 90

QB Ben Roethlisberger threw his third touchdown of 94+ yards in Week Eight's 20-15 win at Detroit in 2017, becoming the first quarterback in NFL history with three touchdown passes of 94+ yards and the fourth in NFL history with three touchdown throws of 90+ yards, joining Len Dawson, Joe Montana and Billy Wade.

His 97-yard connection with WR JuJu Smith-Schuster is the longest passing play in franchise history and ties as the longest offensive play in franchise record books.

Brown opened the 2017 season setting a new team Kickoff Weekend record for receptions with 11 for 182 receiving yards the second-most by a Steeler in a Week One matchup. His 182 receiving yards marked the 30th 100-receiving yard game of his NFL career, breaking a tie for the most such games in team history.

WR Antonio Brown reached the 7,500 scrimmage yard milestone in Week Three's game at Philadelphia in 2016. He accomplished the feat in his 89th career regular-season game to tie Calvin Johnson for the fourth-fewest games to 7,500 scrimmage yards by a wide receiver in NFL history.

Brown reached the 8,000 scrimmage yard mark in Week 10's game vs. Dallas in 2016, in his 95th career regular-season game to mark the sixth-fewest games to 8,000 scrimmage yards by a wide receiver in NFL history.

In Week Five vs. Jacksonville, Brown totaled 10 catches for 157 receiving yards to eclipse the 9,000 scrimmage yard barrier. WR Antonio Brown hit the 9,000 receiving yard milestone in Week Six of 2017 at Kansas City in his 107th regular-season game - the fewest games to the milestone in Steelers history (Hines Ward, 159) and tying Randy Moss for the fourth-fewest games to the milestone in NFL history.

BRYANT'S AVERAGE ABOVE 15.0

WR Martavis Bryant posted game-highs in receiving yards (91) and scrimmage yards (98) in the team's Week Two home opener win against the Minnesota Vikings in 2017, and caught the 15th touchdown reception of his NFL career on a 27-yard completion from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the first quarter. He added his second touchdown catch of the season in Week 12 of 2017 vs. Green Bay on Sunday Night Football, a 17-yard pass from Roethlisberger. He caught four passes for 59 yards, including his third touchdown catch of the season on a 4-yard pass from QB Ben Roethlisberger in the second quarter of Week 15's game vs. New England, increasing career touchdown total to 18 (17 receiving / 1 rushing).

Since entering the NFL in 2014, Bryant has caught 126 passes for 1,917 yards to give him a 15.2 yards per catch average.

Smith-Schuster ended his regular-season rookie year becoming the first rookie in Steelers history to record a kickoff return for a touchdown (96 yards) and a touchdown catch (20 yards) in the same game in Week 17 vs. Cleveland. His 265 combined yards (143 receiving + 122 kickoff return) were the second-most by a rookie in Steelers history (273, Charles Johnson, Dec. 24, 1994 at San Diego).

He totaled a single-game career highs in receiving yards (193), including a 97-yard touchdown catch-and-run from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the team's Week Eight 20-15 win at Detroit. The 97-yard connection is the longest pass play in team history and ties as the longest offensive play in franchise annals. His 193 receiving yards marked the second-most by a Steelers rookie in a single-game, behind Jimmy Orr's 205 on Dec. 13, 1958.

In Week 15 vs. New England, the rookie wide receiver posted the second 100-yard game of 2017, leading the team with 114 yards on a team-best six catches. His 69-yard catch-and-run is the second longest reception of his NFL career.

His five touchdown catches are the most in NFL history by a player before his 21st birthday (turned 21 on Nov. 22).

RINGING THE BELL



RB Le'Veon Bell finished the 2017 regular season third among all NFL players in rushing yards (1,291) and second in yards from scrimmage (1,946). He rushed for at least 100 yards in four games, while adding at least 100 scrimmage yards in nine.

Bell led all players with a game high 186 yards from scrimmage (144 rushing yards on 35 carries / 42 receiving yards on four catches) and scored two rushing touchdowns in the team's 26-9 Week Four win at Baltimore.

The Michigan State product tallied 179 rsuhing yards - tying as the tenth-most in a regular-season game in Steelers history - and the fourth-most in his NFL career in the team's Week Six win at Kansas City.

Bell led all players in rushing yards (134 on 35 carries) and yards from scrimmage (192: 134 rushing / 58 receiving) in Week Seven's 29-14 win vs. Cincinnati at Heinz Field.

On Sunday Night Football in Week 14 against Baltimore, Bell totaled 125 yards from scrimmage (48 rushing / 77 receiving), scoring three touchdowns (two rushing / one receiving) to mark his third game with at least three touchdowns, tying Jerome Bettis and Antonio Brown for the most such games in team history. It is his eighth regular-season game of his NFL career with multiple touchdowns.

RB Le'Veon Bell became the third player in Steelers history with at least 3,000 rushing and 1,500 receiving yards in Week Six at Miami in 2016, joining Franco Harris and Merril Hoge.

Bell reached the 3,000 rushing and 1,500 receiving yard mark in his 38th career regular-season game, surpassing Edgerrin James (42 games) for the fewest games in NFL history to reach the milestone.

OVER 200 TIMES TWO AND FOUR

RB Le'Veon Bell eclipsed 200 rushing yards for the second time in his NFL regular-season career in Week 14 at Buffalo in 2016, racking up a franchise record 236 yards. It marked his second 200-rushing yard performance (204: Nov. 17, 2014) to tie him with Willie Parker for the most 200-rushing yard games in team history.

Bell has eclipsed 200 yards from scrimmage five times in his career, most recently in Week 14 of 2016 at Buffalo.

His five 200-yard scrimmage games are the most in Steelers history, as he broke a tie with Willie Parker (three), and are the most in the NFL since he entered the League in 2013.

TE Jesse James' 2017 regular season totals include singleseason career highs in receptions (43) and receiving yards (372) vards with three touchdown catches to match his single-season best (2016).

James caught six passes for 41 yards with two touchdown catches in the Steelers Week One 21-18 win at Cleveland. It was the first career multi-touchdown game of his NFL career - and marked the 10th such game by a Steelers tight end since 1960 and the first since 2012 (Heath Miller, Sept. 23, 2012 at Oakland).

He hauled in two passes for 42 yards, including a career-long reception of 32 yards from QB Ben Roethlisberger in the second guarter of the team's Week Eight 20-15 win at Detroit.

In Week 11 vs. Tennessee, James caught five passes for 21 vards, including a one-vard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger in the fourth quarter, matching a single-season career high of three touchdown receptions (2016).

James set single-game career highs in receptions (10) and receiving yards (97) in Week 14's 39-38 win vs. Baltimore on Sunday Night Football in 2017.

WILLIAMS ON THE 'D'

LB Vince Williams set a single-season career high and finished second on the team with 8.0 sacks during the 2017 regular season, surpassing his previous mark of 2.0 in 2016, and ranked third on the team's defense with a single-season career best 88 tackles (68 solo).

He posted his first career multi-sack game, finishing with 2.0 against the Chiefs in Week Six.

The Florida State product sacked Indianapolis QB Jacoby Brissett in Week 10 for a loss of four yards in the fourth quarter.

Williams brought down Tennessee QB Marcus Mariota for a nine-yard loss in Week 11, increasing his 2017 sack total to 6.0. He finished the game with 7 tackles (6 solo), three quarterback hits, 2 tackles for losses and 1.0 sack.

Williams started each of the team's 16 regular season games in 2017, and established a single-season career high 88 tackles (68 solo), along with a career-best 14 quarterback hits and adding 11 tackles for losses.

DAVIS IN YEAR TWO

S Sean Davis started each of the Steelers' 16 regular-season games in 2017, and finished with a team-best and career high 90 tackles (69 solo), along with a career bests in interceptions (3), passes defensed (8) and tackles for losses (7), to go along with 1.0 sack, two guarterback hits and a defensive forced fumble.

Davis recorded at least 8 total tackles in four games, including the first double-digit tackle games of his NFL career with 10 vs. New England in Week 15 and a career high 12 vs. Baltimore in Week 14.

In the Week 17 regular season finale vs. Cleveland, the team's 2016 second-round Draft selection posted his sole sack of the season, and hauled in his third interception of the year.

HILTON MAKING AN IMPACT

CB Mike Hilton joined the Steelers' practice squad in December of 2016, and started four-of-16 games played with Pittsburgh in 2017, recording 54 tackles (42 solo), 4.0 sacks, two interceptions, eight quarterback hits and 10 tackles for losses and six passes defensed.

Hilton set a single-game career high with 3.0 sacks and added 6 tackles (all solo) in Week 16 at Houston. He became the third Steelers defensive back with 3.0 sacks in a game since the statistic became official in 1982, joining Troy Polamalu (Sept. 18, 2005 at Houston) and Carnell Lake (Nov. 30, 1997 at Arizona). He tallied the first sack and interception of his NFL career in the Steelers' 26-9 win at Baltimore in Week Four. His sack, a six-yard takedown of Baltimore QB Joe Flacco came in the third quarter, and his interception off of Flacco in the fourth quarter.

In Week 11 vs. Tennessee, Hilton picked off QB Marcus Mariota on the Titans' first offensive possession of the game - marking the Steelers' first of four interceptions in the team's 40-17 win.

BIG PLAY GAY



In Week Seven vs. Cincinnati of 2017, **CB William Gay** hauled in an interception, marking the 13th of his NFL career and 11th as a Steeler, picking off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton.

Gay picked off Cincinnati QB AJ McCarron and returned the ball 23 yards for a touchdown in Week 14's game of 2015. It marked Gay's fifth consecutive interception return for a touchdown, setting a new NFL record, and his fifth pick six with the Steelers, tying Rod Woodson for the most in team history:

With his fifth interception returned for a touchdown, Gay became the 10th active NFL defender with five pick sixes and increased his career total to 10 interceptions, eight as a Steeler.

HADEN JOINS THE STEELERS

The Steelers signed **CB Joe Haden** to a three-year contract on Aug. 30.

Haden, a two-time Pro Bowl selection, made his Steelers debut, appearing in the 91st game of his NFL regular-season career and posted six tackles and 1.0 sack, on Kickoff Weekend at the Cleveland Browns. He brought down Cleveland QB DeShone Kizer for a sack of three yards to end the first half – his first sack with the Steelers – third of his NFL career – and first since Sept. 11, 2011 (with Cleveland). In Week Seven vs. Cincinnati, Haden hauled in the 20th interception of his NFL career and his first as a Steeler, picking off Cincinnati QB Andy Dalton in the third quarter.

Since entering the NFL in 2010, Haden has recorded 108 passes defensed - the third-most among all NFL defenders:

The University of Florida product was a first-round (seventh overall) draft selection of the Browns in 2010. He has started 92of-101 games played in the NFL and his career numbers include 389 tackles (316 solo), 20 interceptions, 108 passes defensed, four forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and 3.0 sacks.

MITCHELL IN THE BACKFIELD

S Mike Mitchell tallied 53 tackles (35 solo) in the 2017 regular season, to go along with two passes defensed, one tackle for loss, a quarterback hit and a defensive fumble recovery in 13 games played, all starts.

Mitchell led Pittsburgh's secondary with 11 tackles, all solo, in Week Three at Chicago, along with adding one pass defensed.

WATT IN ROOKIE YEAR

LB T.J. Watt - the Steelers' first round selection the 2017 NFL Draft - recorded 52 tackles (39 solo), 7.0 sacks, 10 tackles for losses, 12 quarterback hits, eight passes defensed, an interception, a forced fumble and blocked a field goal attempt in 15 games played, all starts, in his 2017 rookie season.

Watt's 7.0 sacks topped the 2017 NFL rookie linebacker class - tied for second among all NFL rookies - and are the second-most by a rookie in Steelers history:

He converted a 46-yard game-winning field goal the fifth game-winning kick in his regular-season career and fourth of 2017 (within one minute of regulation or overtime).
- In Week 15 vs. New England, Boswell converted his sole field goal attempt of the game - a 51-yard field goal in the second quarter – the sixth successful field goal of at least 50 yards in his NFL career – all occurring at Heinz Field.

BOS FROM 50-PLUS

K Chris Boswell converted four field goals from 50 yards or further in 2017 - the most by a Steelers kicker in a single-season. Boswell has made six-of-eight field goal attempts in his NFL career from 50 yards or further.

His six field goals made from 50-plus yards are the third-most in Steelers history (Gary Anderson and Jeff Reed: eight).

Since joining the Steelers in 2015, Boswell is 85-of-95 overall on field goal attempts (89.5%), including 29-of-34 (85.3%) between 40-49 yards.

PRESEASON GAME #1 PITTSBURGH 20, NEW YORK GIANTS 12 AUG. 11, 2017 METLIFE STADIUM (73,979)

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. – A pair of Pittsburgh's 2017 rookie draft class members highlighted the team's first preseason game of the season. Rookie **QB Joshua Dobbs** and **OLB T.J. Watt** made their NFL debuts and each helped their respective units to lead the team to a 20-12 win at the New York Giants.

The Giants opened up the scoreboard with field goals from Aldrick Rosas and Mike Nugent in the opening two quarters before Steelers' **K Chris Boswell** connected on a 48-yard field goal to make the score 6-3 in the second quarter.

Pittsburgh's special teams unit sparked the team prior to halftime. **CB Mike Hilton** recovered a muffed punt of the Giants at their 28-yard line. On the team's first play of the drive, Dobbs connected with **WR Cobi Hamilton** for a 28-yard touchdown to give the Steelers a 10-9 lead heading into halftime.

Nugent and Boswell traded field goals in the third stanza and Steelers **RB Terrell Watson** scampered 15 yards to the end zone in the fourth quarter to produce the game's final points.

Dobbs, earning the starting nodd at quarterback, completed 8-of-15 passes for 100 yards with a touchdown, while Watt recorded 2.0 guarterback sacks and five total tackles.

Hamilton led all receivers with a game-high 72 receiving yards on two catches as Watson finished with 44 rushing yards on 10 carries. Steelers LB **Arthur Moats** tallied 3.0 quarterback sacks as the defense finished with a total of seven quarterback takedowns in the contest.

GAME #1 PITTSBURGH 21, CLEVELAND 18 SEPT. 10, 2017 FIRSTENERGY STADIUM (67,431)

CLEVELAND, Ohio – The Steelers were victorious in the team's 2017 regular-season opener, defeating the Cleveland Browns, 21-18.

Pittsburgh drew first blood when Steelers LB Tyler Matakevich blocked a Cleveland punt, which was recovered in the end zone by Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo for a touchdown early in the first quarter. Cleveland responded with a 68-yard drive that culminated in a one-yard touchdown run from QB DeShone Kizer.

Begining on their own nine yard-line, Steelers **QB Ben Roethlisberger** connected with **WR Antonio Brown** for a 50yard gain to aide the Steelers on a 91-yard drive that resulted in a Roethlisberger touchdown pass to **TE Jesse James**, giving the Steelers an advantage of 14-7 just before halftime.

With a short field, Cleveland began driving in the third quarter, but an eight-yard sack from rookie **LB T.J. Watt** forced the Browns to settle for a field goal from K Zane Gonzalez.

The Steelers increased their lead to 21-10 following a two-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to James, giving James his first career multi-touchdown performance.

Cleveland found the end zone one final time when Kizer connected with Corey Coleman on a three-yard touchdown pass and followed up with a successful two-point conversion, but wasn't able to overcome it's deficit as Pittsburgh claimed a 21-18 victory.

Brown led all receivers with 182 receiving yards, including 102 in the first half. Watt finished the game with 2.0 sacks and one interception, becoming the third player in NFL history to do so in his NFL debut, and the first on Kickoff Weekend.

GAME #3 CHICAGO 23, PITTSBURGH 17 OT **SEPT. 24, 2017 SOLDIER FIELD (62,172)**

CHICAGO, III. - The Steelers suffered their first loss of the regular season, falling to the Chicago Bears in overtime, 23-17, at Soldier Field. Trailing by seven in the second quarter, QB Ben Roethlisberger found WR Antonio Brown in the end zone for his first touchdown reception of 2017. On the ensuing drive, Bears QB Mike Glennon responded with a touchdown of his own, taking a 14-7 lead.

At the end of the first half, Bears CB Sherrick McManis blocked a Steelers field goal that was recovered by Chicago and returned 70 yards. Near the goal line the ball carrier was stripped by TE Vance McDonald and knocked out of bounds in the end zone. Due to a penalty, the ball was placed at the one-yard-line, and a field goal gave the Bears a 17-7 lead going into halftime.

In the third guarter, Steelers RB Le'Veon Bell narrowed the gap with his first touchdown run of 2017. A Pittsburgh field goal from K Chris Boswell tied the game at 17-17 early in the fourth. The rest of the quarter remained scoreless as time expired, forcing overtime.

Chicago won the coin toss and utilized a four-play 74yard drive to score a touchdown and end the game, 23-17.

GAME #6 PITTSBURGH 19, KANSAS CITY 13 OCT. 15, 2017 ARROWHEAD STADIUM (76,994)

The Steelers responded on the following drive with a 51-yard touchdown pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** to **WR Antonio Brown**, extending their lead to 19-10.

Kansas City K Harrison Butker put three more points on the scoreboard for the Chiefs, but on Kansas City's final drive of the game, an 8-yard sack on third-down by LB James Harrison sealed a 19-13 victory for Pittsburgh.

LB Vince Williams produced the first multi-sack game of his career, bringing down Smith twice. Harrison's game-ending sack brought his career total to 80.5, the most by a Steeler and sixth-most among active players since the statistic became official in 1982.

Brown finished the game with eight receptions for 155 yards. Bell's 179 rushing yards tied as the tenth-most in a single-game in Steelers history and the fourth-most in his NFL regular-season career.

GAME #9 PITTSBURGH 20, INDIANAPOLIS 17 NOV. 12, 2017 LUCAS OIL STADIUM (66,146)

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. – After a rocky start, the Pittsburgh Steelers racked up 17 straight points in the second half on their way to a 20-17 victory over the Indianapolis Colt at Lucas Oil Stadium.

Following a scoreless first quarter, Colts QB Jacoby Brissett connected with WR Donte Moncrief for a 60-yard touchdown. On its next drive, Indianapolis K Adam Vinatieri added three more points, extending the Colts lead to 10-0.

Steelers **K Chris Boswell** responded with three points of his own on a 41-yard field goal just before the end of the first half.

After a Colts touchdown on the opening drive of the second half, Steelers **QB Ben Roethlisberger** ochestrated an eight-play 78yard drive that culminated in a 7-yard touchdown pass to rookie **WR JuJu Smith-Schuster**. Early in the fourth quarter, **LB Ryan Shazier** picked off Brissett, giving the Steelers a short field which allowed Roethlisberger to find **TE Vance McDonald** in the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown. Roethlisberger connected with **WR Martavis Bryant** on the 2-point conversion attempt, the game up at 17-17.

On the final play of regulation, Boswell converted a 33-yard game-winning field goal as time expired - the second game-winning field goal of his regular-season career.

GAME #10 PITTSBURGH 40, TENNESSEE 17 NOV. 16, 2017 HEINZ FIELD (60,703)

PITTSBURGH – **QB Ben Roesthlisberger** threw four touchdown passes - three to **WR Antonio Brown** - in the Steelers' 40-17 victory over the Tennessee Titans at Heinz Field.

Pittsburgh scored on it's opening drive for the fifth time this season with a 41-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to Brown. The Steelers put up three more points on their following possession with a 41-yard field goal from **K Chris Boswell** after **CB Mike Hilton** intercepted Titans QB Marcus Mariota, giving Pittsburgh a short field.

Tennessee struck back with a 7-yard touchdown run from Mariota, tightening the score at 10-7. The Titans looked to tie things up with a 48-yard field goal attempt from K Ryan Succop, but the kick was blocked by Pittsburgh **LB T.J. Watt**. - the first blocked field goal by the Steelers since Oct. 16, 2016 at Miami.

Boswell helped the Steelers extend their lead to 16-7 before the end of the half, with two more field goals from 28 and 50 yards out. His 50-yard field goal was the third field goal of at least 50 yards in his NFL career, and first of 2017.

Mariota tightened the score to 16-14 early in the second half with a deep pass to WR Rishard Matthews that resulted in a 75-yard touchdown.

Roethisberger responded with his second touchdown pass to Brown. Another Titans field goal from Succop moved the score to 23-17 before the end of the quarter.

In the fourth quarter, the Steelers racked up 17 unanswered points, including touchdown passes from Roethlisberger to **TE Jesse James** and Brown, as well as a fourth field goal by Boswell for a 40-17 victory.

Despite two starters sitting out with injuries, the Steelers' secondary picked off Mariota four times with Hilton, **CB Coty Sensabaugh**, **S Robert Golden** and **S Sean Davis** all recording interceptions. The Pittsburgh defense also recorded five sacks including 2.0 from **DE Cameron Heyward**, marking the fourth multi-sack game of his NFL career and his second of 2017.

GAME #11 PITTSBURGH 31, GREEN BAY 28 NOV. 26, 2017 HEINZ FIELD (62,147)

PITTSBURGH – The Steelers sealed a 31-28 victory over Green Bay with a 53-yard field goal from **K Chris Boswell** - a career long and the longest field goal from a Steeler in Heinz Field history.

Pittsburgh found the end zone on its opening possession for the second week in a row when **QB Ben Roethlisberger** connected with **TE Xavier Grimble** on a 1-yard touchdown pass. After an unsuccessful extra point attempt, the Packers pulled ahead 14-6 with a pair of touchdown passes from Green Bay QB Brett Hundley on back-to-back Packers' drives.

Pittsburgh tied things up with a 17-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to **WR Martavis Bryant**, followed by a successful two-point conversion on a pass from Roethlisberger to **WR Antonio Brown**. But the Packers pulled ahead again on the opening drive of the second half when Green Bay WR Davante Adams broke free after a pass from Hundley, resulting in a 55-yard touchdown.

An interception from Roethlisberger gave Green Bay an opportunity to increase its lead, but a pair of sacks on Hundley by Steelers **DEs L.T. Walton** and **Cameron Heyward** gave Pittsburgh the ball back. The Steelers capitalized on the ensuing drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to Brown.

A second sack from Heyward on third down forced the Packers to go three-and-out on their next drive, setting up Pittsburgh to take it's first lead since the first quarter with a touchdown pass from Roethlisberger to Brown - Roethlisberger's fourth touchdown pass and Brown's second touchdown catch of the night.

Once again, the Packers responded with a touchdown of their own, tying the game at 28 with 2:02 remaining in the fourth quarter. Pittsburgh was forced to punt on the following drive, but the Steelers defense kept the Packers at bay with the help of a 6-yard sack on Hundley by rookie **LB T.J. Watt**, which allowed the offense to get the ball back with 0:17 remaining in regulation.

Adiving catch by Brown on a 23-yard pass from Roethlisberger along the Steelers' sideline set up Boswell's game-winning 53-yard field goal.

Brown finished the game with 10 catches for 169 yards, while **RB Le'Veon Bell** amassed 183 yards from scrimmage and set a Steelers record with 12 catches - the most by a running back in a single game in franchise history.

Pittsburgh struggled to gain momentum in the first half following the injury as Cincinnati pulled ahead 17-0. K Chris Boswell got the Steelers on the board with a 3-yard field goal at the end of the second quarter. When play resumed after halftime, the Steelers defense forced Cincinnati to go three-and-out. The Steelers scored their first touchdown of the game on the following drive when QB Ben Roethlisberger connected with RB Le'Veon Bell who sped past defenders on the sideline for a 35-yard touchdown. A Cincinnati field goal left the Steelers trailing 20-10 through three quarters. After a second field goal from Boswell, Roethlisberger

found **WR Antonio Brown** in the end zone to tied the game at 20. Pittsburgh sealed its victory with a 38-yard field goal from Boswell on

the final play of the game - his third game-winner of the 2017 season. The Steelers defense forced the Bengals to go three-and out three times in the fourth quarter. Roethlisbergerreached 50,000 passing yards in his regular season

Allen extended the lead with a 9-yard touchdown run. Late in the third quarter, the Steelers snapped back with an 11-

yard touchdown run from Bell, his third scoring play of the night. With just 0:42 left to play, a 46-yard field goal from Boswell pushed the Steelers past the Ravens and sealed a 39-38 victory. The kick was Boswell's fourth game-winner of 2017, within one minute of regulation.

HOUSTON, Texas – The Steelers held the Texans scoreless until the fourth quarter in their 34-6 victory over Houston at NRG Stadium. Pittburgh scored on back-to-back drives to start the

game, taking an early 10-0 lead over Houston. At the beginning of the second quarter, the Texans utilized an eight-play, 80-yard drive to take the ball down to the Pittsburgh

1-yard line, but failed to capitalize as **CB Artie Burns** picked off Texans QB T.J. Yates in the end zone on fourth down. The Steelers collected 10 more points off a 1-yard

touchdown run by **FB Roosevelt Nix** and a field goal from **K Chris Boswell**, before going into halftime with a 20-0 lead. In the second half, Pittsburgh continued to roll with a

GAME #16 PITTSBURGH 28, CLEVELAND 24 DEC. 31, 2017 HEINZ FIELD (50,704)

PITTSBURGH - The Steelers completed a 6-0 sweep of the AFC North and finished the season 13-3, their best regular-season record since 2004 (15-1), with a 28-24 win over the Cleveland Browns at Heinz Field. Pittsburgh took an early lead in the game, with a 29-yard touchdown run on a reverse to WR Darrius Heyward-Bey on the team's opening drive. The Steelers rolled to 14-0 when QB Landry Jones connected with rookie WR JuJu Smith-Schuster for a 20-yard touchdown reception. Cleveland put itself on the scoreboard in the second quarter when Browns RB Duke Johnson Jr. found the end zone with a 2-yard touchdown run. The Steelers responded with a touchdown run of their own on a 4-yard gain from RB Stevan Ridley. In the second half, the Browns tied the game at 21 racking up 14-straight points. Pittsburgh re-gained its lead on a 96-yard kickoff return by Smith-Schuster - the first by a Steeler since 2010. Cleveland added a field goal, but wasn't able to overcome its deficit, as the Steelers seeling their 13th win of the season. Smith-Schuster finished the game with 265 combined yards (143 receiving + 122 kickoff return) - second-most by a rookie in Steelers history.

The defense sacked Browns QB DeShone Kizer six times, bringing its total sacks on the season to 56 - the most in a single season in franchise history.
